song was repeated over and over again along with "Give peace a chance," as the marchers reached their destination.

Rev. Chester Richardson started the post march rally with stirring words of inspiration. He said that many felt that the march would be counterproductive and that it might incite violence, however, the march and rally had proceeded without a hitch.

"Many people said that we couldn't do this. That we couldn't come together and march together in peace and unity and in brotherhood, sisterhood and in love, in concern about our neighborhoods, our community, our city. As Joanna says all the time, this is not LA, this is Las Vegas! - We can fix it. We can fix anything that needs to be fixed when we work together, when we sit down and reason with one another, when we sit down and start caring for one another," he said.

Wesley-Lee said that the united effort was long overdue. "This community effort, where people could come together and form a united front, is long overdue.

I am so happy and grateful that you took the time to be a part of this. I would also like to commend Metro for their strong support.

When we walk together, and lock arms together and talk together about a common cause, you find that we all are the same. This is not a Westside issue, it is not per se, a Green Valley issue, or a Lakes issue. It is an issue for all citizens in the State of Nevada," she retorted.

Rev. Rogers said that he hoped that the "All of Us Together" and "Community Peace" organizations would continue to be active beyond the Rodney King verdict and he had hoped for a better turn out.

"We want to keep this ongoing. This morning I am wearing a badge that states "All of Us Together", and as I stand here on these City Hall steps, I also stood on the steps of Las Vegas High School with quite a few of our dignitaries and I am appalled that they are not here. If you come out in the beginning, we need you now to be here with us," he said.

Rev. Richardson, in an exclusive interview after the rally, said that there are plans for a mass city-wide march that was proposed by the Mayor of Las Vegas and others that would
