A CURSILLISTA'S COMMENTS

Nearly three weeks removed, but still somewhat in the afterglow of Easter, I reflect on that most important feast of the Christian year. It represents the focal point of our faith, the day set aside to observe The Leader's conquest over death, and thus our victory as well. As St. Paul says, vain would be our faith had Jesus not risen from the dead. For most of those living two millenia ago the resurrection was a nonevent, and it was certainly not covered by the secular media, such as it was in those days. Nevertheless we, some two-thousand years later, believed with all our heart that it occured because we have faith...don't we?

Faith is an essential ingredient in the liberation struggle of African Americans. Our 19th century heroes had to have it, and in this century the faith of such as Garvey. Malcolm, King and others helped sustain our struggle for freedom up to the present and into the future. For black Christians that faith had better originate in Jesus the Liberator, for it is he who, we believe, will lead us to deliverance from our oppressors in America today. By

the way, when I mentioned King it was Martin to whom I alluded, although there's another who has been in our thoughts lately... Rodney.

As the post-verdict analysis continues we're aware that our faith of another kind has been tested-our faith in "The System", the establishment. Many of us have noted with unavoidable, and understandable cynicism the renewed interest of those outside the black community in our milieu with respect to racism. This "consciousness" brought to us the "All of Us together" campaign and other manifestations of sensitivity. To be sure, no amount of propaganda, no proliferation of buttons and bumper stickers blinds us to the fact that most of the progenitors cared for us until the potential for civil unrest became palpable. Suddenly, and predictably, there appeared the mayor, heretofore a phantom in the daily lives of black citizens, and the bizarre sight of Metro cops walking hand-in-hand with the same black children they've been terrorizing. We were largely unimpressed by the eagerness of the school district to take part in these public relations which spoke in so timely a manner to issues

we've implored it to address year 'round

Our faith was not to these theatrics but rather to The Leader, and in ourselves. We believe in our capacity to disdain turning our anger inward, destroying ourselves and the little property we have. St. Paul also writes. "If you go on biting and tearing one another to pieces, take care! You will end up in mutual destruction." (Gal.5:15) We believe, not in the oppressive system, but in a love among black brothers and sisters that transcends frustration with the bitterness toward our real enemies. We have faith in Our Lord who promised us a life free of slavery, and our prodigious task is to keep the faith with patient endurance and tireless activism in behalf of liberation. "The Lord does not delay in keeping His promise though some consider it 'delay!" (2 Pet. 3:9)

With or without, but mostly without the inspiration of a Rodney King trial we must be ever mindful that the work of liberation is hard indeed, but it is precisely in the performance of that hard work that we express our faith in Jesus the Liberator, for we are His hands to undertake that
