for men, said he thinks that the verdict served to keep the peace. "I think with the two being indicted, that this will keep the peace. I feel strongly that all four should have been indicted from what I've seen. It was just too much force used on one man. As far as the Criminal Justice System, it really needs a lot of work. If you have a good attorney and the proper finances, you will walk free. The justice system punishes and abuses the poor and people of color. That's not justice," he said.

"Naturally, I didn't like the verdict. I am grateful that something was done to semi-correct the injustice that was done.

The Criminal Justice System stinks and it needs a major overhaul and many modifications to correct it," he said.

Brenda Richardson, 31, said that she was satisfied with the verdict. "I felt that justice was served. They weren't going to get them all in the beginning, but at least they indicted two of them.

tative from Nevada.

"After the last town hall meeting, our elected representatives indicated they wanted an opportunity to address this issue with our community in person. With the cooperation of Reverend Rogers of the New Jerusalem Baptist Church, we gave them that opportunity. None of them responded," said Watson. "I want to make every effort to be fair and I want our elected officials to be accountable to their

constituents. Because this is such an important issue to our state and community, we will schedule yet another town hall meeting. Maybe this time they will accept the challenge."

A new poll, which was done by Decision Research on behalf of the State Agency for Nuclear Projects/Nuclear Waste Projects Office, was conducted during the period of March 15 to March 25.

The poll found Nevadans overwhelmingly opposed a high-level nuclear waste dump and

are against negotiating with the federal government for benefits by a more than 2 to 1 margin.

"The nuclear power industry wants Nevada to give up it's fight against Yucca Mountain and put the safety of it's residents on the auction block in exchange for negotiating for benefits," Governor Bob Miller said.

"The state is not for sale. Nevadans have convincingly declared they will refuse such an indecent proposal," Miller said.

A statewide poll conducted by Penn Schoen and Associates in February, however, sampled over 700 Nevada registered voters and found that 83 percent believe that Gov. Miller should begin discussions about benefits.

Seventy-five percent of those polled also thought that despite their campaign pledges to fight the study, elected officials should now urge the state to begin negotiations for benefits.



attacked Ray & Ross' financial suitability to perform airport operations. Ray & Ross' premise of overwhelming growth was also attacked. Interveners stated that while there is admittedly some growth taking place, the growth cannot sustain another carrier and that irreparable damage would be done to existing carriers. Interveners further stated that the company's financial balance sheet fails to meet the equity ratio required by the PSC.

Ray & Ross disputed these claims by providing an audited financial report which confirmed the equity requirement. The company also provided marketing statistics and expert witnesses which collaborated the predicted growth statistics. Company representatives, however, are confident that the eventual outcome of the application will be favorable. Armstrong says he is very optimistic that airport operations will commence by late summer to early fall.
