over arguing with white men as to who is to be the chief oppressor of black people. You see white women can argue they suffer the same discrimination as African Americans (Men and Women), but that is now quite true. White women have never been lynched to put them in their place, but Afro-American men and women have been lynched for demanding Constituional rights. A white woman last summer was allowed to stand smack dab in front of the door of the Department of Motor Vehicles and pass out literature, where as an Afro-American man, (yours truly), was arrested for standing in an area that had previously been designated as a place for black folks to collect signatures.

Now, I am not arguing that there is no discrimination against women, indeed there is, and it must be stopped, but in the larger context, you can not expect Africans to willingly participate in a debate over who will be allowed to exterminate us.

The reason that I feel that African women have not joined in large or significant numbers in the Women's Movement, is because we all can see that that is an argument, as I mentioned, between the two oppressors as:

The universal word to describe the black community before the civil rights movement, was the word "colored." If you were colored, or had any distinguishable traces of African blood, then you had to drink from our water fountain, or be lynched from the oak tree! In that setting, there could be no third world people or non blacks, because any trace of African blood meant you were as colored as the most milk chocolate brotha in the community!

So...you see, because we moved from the word colored to the most concrete definition of our African ancestry, modern colored people can say, I'm not black. That is fine by me because, it proves that we have made great strides in the fight for civil, and human rights. At one time we "all" would have been slaves, being burned at the stake, but now we can be who we want to be...and for me personally, I choose to be black and proud!
