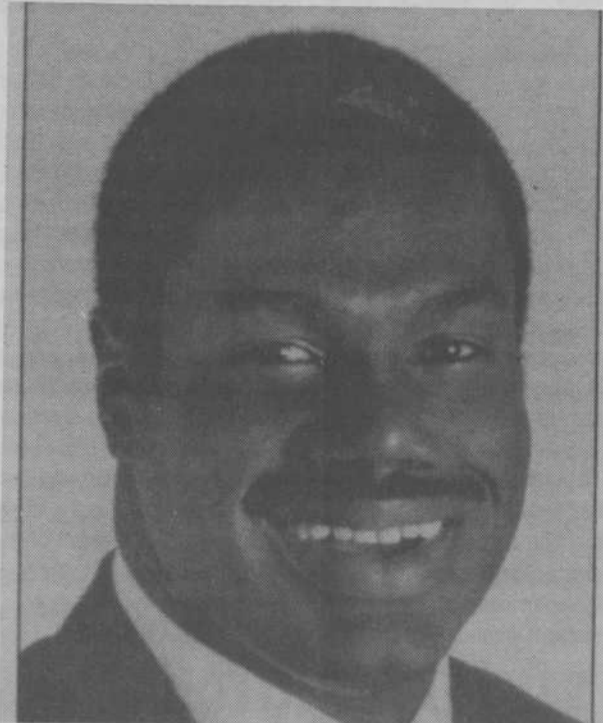


TRIBBLE TO LEAVE UNLV ATHLETIC DEPARTMENT, TAKES LOYALTY AND FRIENDSHIP WITH HIM

UNLV Athletic Director Jim Weaver announced Monday that Senior Associate Athletic Director Keith Tribble has been named Executive Director of the Federal Express Orange Bowl.

"I enjoyed the experience (at UNLV)," said Tribble. "I met good people and had the opportunity to work for and with professionals, but this opportunity only comes along once in a lifetime."

Tribble, 37, was responsible for the day-to-day operations of the athletic department. While at UNLV, he also served as a special consultant to the inaugural Las Vegas Bowl, which takes place at the Sam Boyd Silver Bowl.

Tribble, who begins his new duty on July 1, said that he will

be leaving a good friend behind in Weaver. "I learned a lot about loyalty and friendship, which is important in anything you do. (Weaver) is focused."

"He believes in what he's doing and I hope the citizens and community of Las Vegas

get behind the program and make UNLV a great institution."

Tribble, a native of Miami, becomes the fourth executive director in the Orange Bowl's 60-year history. He served on the athletic administrative staff at the University of Florida from

1981-89 and served as the executive director of the Blockbuster Bowl from 1990-92 before arriving at UNLV on February 18, 1992.

Keith has always been helpful in assisting the LVSV, and we all wish him well at his new post.
