## AFRICAN-AMERICAN HISTORY ROBERT SMALLS (NAVAL HERO)

Robert Smalls was born in Beaufort South Carolina, on April 5, 1839. As all slaves, he was prevented from doing the things he dreamed of doing. He could not gain an education without breaking the law nor could anyone teach him without breaking the law also.

In 1851 he was sent to Char-

leston to begin work as an outfitter for ships. He became very familiar with ships and sailing. According to the House of Representative Records Forty-Seventh Congress second session report no. 1887, which placed Smalls on the retired list of the navy, he was entitled to retirement because of his valuable service to the country during the Civil War.

On May 13, 1862, the Confederate Steamboat "Planter" was

taken out of the Port of Charleston and delivered to one of the vessels of the Federal fleet then blockading the port.

With great skill Smalls and eight other African men along with five women and his three children led the ship past enemy Confederates and surrendered it to the union forces. His courage made him one of the first African American naval heros.
