

OUESTION 3:

Will add 500 more beds to the county jail. The county jail houses potential felons and gross misdemeanants. It is the only jail in Southern Nevada responsible for these offenders. At times, the county jail has hundreds of prisoners over its capacity. The federal courts won't allow that to

While other local jails may have a few extra beds, they are not maximum security jails. By law, the county jail is the only maximum security jail in Southern Nevada. The county must house people who are arrested for major crimes such as murder, rape, armed robbery. . .and are awaiting trial. Nobody wants these people out of jail and on our streets.

What's The Cost?

If all three measures pass, the maximum cost will be a dollar a week, \$52 a year, for the owner of a \$100,000 home.

Nobody likes to pay more taxes. If there were another way to put these critical programs into effect.. it would have already been done. The fact is, without passage of this bond, these programs can't happen.

The one saving grace is ... you will know that every dollar of this money is going towards your personal security. And one of America's top police departments will be made even stronger to help protect our community.

Citizens for Safe Streets honestly believe this to be one of the most important ballot propositions in many years. We do hope you will take the time and go to the polls on June 8th and vote YES on this vital crime fighting plan.

What If This Plan Doesn't Pass?

Naturally, the men and women of the Metropolitan Police Department will continue to do their utmost to protect all of us regardless of the outcome of this or any other election. During the current administration of Sheriff John Moran, crime in Las Vegas has dropped from 4th to 80th in the FBI's statistical rankings for violent crime. Metro is also one of the few major departments accredited by the Commission on Accreditation for Law Enforcement Agencies.
