(Continued from Page 17) cheesecloth or some other adequate material (old nylon hose) and change it frequently. Seal holes and cracks in the floor around heating or other pipes with adhesive tape.

Clean the child's room daily and do a thorough and complete cleaning of floors, furniture, tops of doors, window frames, sills, etc., with a damp cloth or oil mop once a week. While cleaning, air the room thoroughly, but then keep doors and windows closed as much as possible, especially when not using the room.

In addition, strong odors often trigger allergy and asthma symptoms. The Allergy and Asthma Network in Fairfax, Virginia, advises parents to use aerosol cans, paints, insecticides, detergents, chemicals, household cleaners, strong soaps, perfumes, cosmetics, air fresheners, and potpourri away from the child and in a well-ventilated area

Another asthma trigger is animal dander (small scales from animal hair or bird feathers). Dr. Alvarez explains that a lot of parents claim that pets don't affect the child, but she feels they should be tested to make sure. Hanson agrees. Cats, dogs, birds, etc. can cause a lot of problems for kids with asthma, but families are often reluctant to give them up," says Hanson.

Once parents have their

child's triggers and have done all they can to help avoid them, it is important for them to work with their doctor to learn how to manage the asthma with appropriate medication. There are three main types of asthma medication. Anti-inflamatory agents act directly to reduce the inflamatory response of the airways. They come in pill and in aerosol form. The oral form causes side-effects for some, but the inhaled form seems safe for most patients. Anti-allergy drugs, work to prevent triggers from causing attacks but they do not work after an episode starts.

Once an attack occurs, bronchodilators may be used to relax the muscles of the airways and

open them up. They are available as tablets and sprays, though the latter is usually preferred because it acts faster and has fewer side-effects. Bronchodilators are best used as needed, but with caution.

The National Heart, Lung and Blood Institute warns, "It is dangerous to rely too much on using inhaled bronchodilators since they only provide temporary relief of symptoms. The underlying inflamation can get increasingly worse if not dealt with directly. Also, having their symptoms relieved often makes patients less cautious about avoiding triggers, which can increase the inflamatory response as well.

"Controlling and avoiding triggers, is just as important as taking the prescribed medications, but it should not take their place,"

He maintains that parents should know how to intervene to prevent an attack, when medication is necessary, in what dosage, and when it may be necessary to take their child to the hospital.
