Sunday evening, President Clinton named two people to replace Arnold Schwarzenegger as chief of the President's Council on Physical Fitness and Sports, including Olympic track star Florence Griffith-Joyner.

Joyner will advise the president, "on ways to enhance opportunities for all Americans-not just the young-to participate in physical fitness and sports activities," Clinton said.

Also named to head the council was basketball star Tom McMillen. The president and the first lady Hillary Clinton played host to a number of sports figures preceding the National Sports Award Gala at Constitution Hall.

The late Arthur Ashe, former tennis star and human-rights activist, was honored by Clinton with the President Medal of Free-

dom. Clinton presented the award to Ashe's widow Jeanne. president praised Ashe for his fight against racism and his crusade against the AIDS virus.

Griffith-Joyner, "the world's fastest woman," turned in gold medal performances in the 100-meter dash, 200-meter dash and 400meter relay and won a silver medal in the 1600-meter relay at the 1988 Olympic Games in Seoul.

Flo-Jo, the "Agassi of Track-and-Field," carried "glamour" to the sport with her multicolors, including her fingernails and one-legged running outfits.

"I thank you for lending your dignity to this occasion and for your service to this country and your embodiment of the best values of America," said Clinton.
