Clinton health care task force; Richard Reynolds, M.D., executive vice president of the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation; Edward O'Neil, M.P.A., Ph.D., executive director of the Pew Health Professionals Commission, an eight-year national initiative to direct reform in health profession education; and Richard Smith, M.D., Ph.D., the developer of the MEDEX Primary Health Care Series, a blueprint to
