Reading is a basic educa-

tional skill that is essential to learning and acquiring knowledge. Unless you are illiterate, you shouldn't have an excuse not to read. Everyone in civilized society should read. People should read consistently and daily. For enjoyment and for information.

Not only is reading fundamental, but it is crucial to survival in today's complex world.

It's O.K. to watch TV in moderation. But it's not the same as being able to read and to select books, newspapers, pamphlets and other periodic reading material that keeps you in the know.

My good friend, Washington D.C. Black psychiatrist Dr. Frances Cress Welsing considers reading is a crucial part of her solution for Black people's survival in a racist society. "Read, read, read, read, read," Welsing stresses whenever she gives one of her famous afrocentric group presentations.

When I visited her hotel room while she was on the road, Dr. Welsing had at least five different newspapers that she was poring through on the coffee table. "I constantly have to have a variety of reading material so I can keep up with what's happening in the world. Ultimately, you come across something buried way back in paper somewhere that is extremely significant relative to the survival of Black folk," she said.

Unfortunately though, reading is not a high priority for some Blacks, especially those in the Black underclass. Because they are preoccupied with everyday survival. If you don't know where your next meal is coming from it's ridiculous to expect you to read five newspapers daily.

That is the obvious dilemma for many African-Americans basic survival from day-to-day, as opposed to higher-level survival as a race.

With those considerations in mind, if you have the time or can make the time, I appeal to you to get involved with a new reading group that's forming right now in Las Vegas. It's called Appreciating Books in our Community, or ABC. This Afrocentric literary group is sponsored by the Las Vegas Alliance of Black School Educators (LVABSE), under the direction of Dr. Linda Young, president of the organization.

Young people and children are also encouraged to participate. "It's a great way for us to forge a positive literary alliance among fellow African-Americans," Dr. Young said.

JAMES S. TATE JR., MD chief. If that is true, then we cannot criticize the shaman for being a poor chief, if we indeed have asked them to do that. We can not ask the church to play the leadership in the struggle for liberation because that is not what the church is there for. The church if there to support that effort but not necessarily to lead it. If we then abandon the field to everyone else and there is no left but the shaman to lead, the shaman leads because the shaman has to fill the vacuum that is left there. Again, we cannot turn on the shaman and criticize the shaman for leading. I note that today there are, all together, too many religious leaders, who presently lead organizations, that are involved in struggle. I bring this up only to say that when that situation occurs, there is a strong risk in that there will be errors of position and errors of strategy, which go back to the primary training and philosophy of the shaman vs. the chief. Therefore, before we criticize the shaman we must first make sure that there are ample chiefs to go around, so that the shaman may return to the temple and the chiefs may continue to lead the people.
