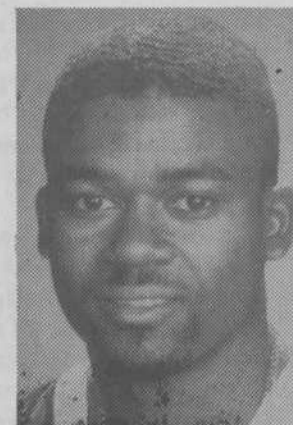
"Vegas, we wanted Jerry to be a part of it also."

6'2"-180lb. QB :

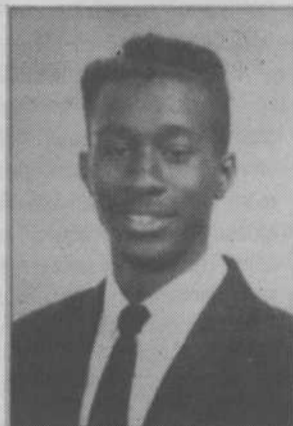

6'4"-195lb. CB :

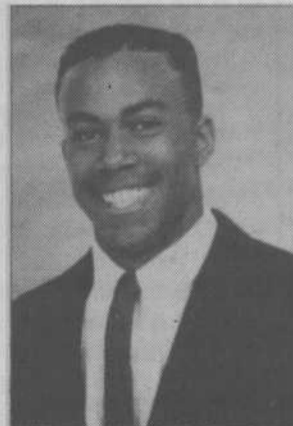

6'1"-185lb. SS :

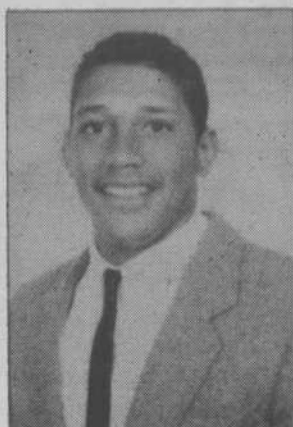
