when I left that meeting, I decided that we needed a similar program in North Las Vegas."

"I then put together a proposal to assist Wanda Thatcher, Executive Director of N.L.V. Housing Authority, in her endeavors in a capacity such as a Resident Initiative Coordinator type-of-person. I then decided to present to the public and to the City of North Las Vegas, these eight young ladies who were putting forward an initiative on their own to better themselves and their family and eventually become independent of welfare and/orlow-income housing," she added

When interviewed by the local broadcast media - Channel 8 and Channel 13 respectively who interviewed some of the honorees in their apartments, they were asked about what prompted them to further educate themselves. For the most part, the response they gave were "because somebody cared

enough to encourage us."

According to Williams, if that encouragement is coming from management and from City Hall, before you know it, there will be success stories all over the Las Vegas valley and throughout Clark County.

"For the most part, in lowincome housing neighborhoods, most of the residents spend ten or twelve hours a day, most of them don't have jobs, so if it starts with management, and then the Las Vegas Housing Authority, and then the community, there will be 80 to 100 or more single mothers coming from Carey Arms, Herbert Gerson Park, Donna Street and other areas because we are accentuating the positive. Channel 8 called the news story 'A Better Life' she said. 'It is shameful that we have to have the media come in and do it - recognize those who are uplifting themselves while I have been attempting to get the N.L.V. Public Relations Department to do this since

October of 1992. I am willing to assist the department in getting this done," she said.

Carey Arms Apartment residents who received Certificates of Recognition were: Lovell McDowell, who received a Certified Nurses Assistant Certificate (CNA); Mercedes Green, who is enrolled in an adult education class with 1 1/2 credits needed to get her high school diploma and also receiving her CNA certificate; Charisma Whatley, who received her GED and Substitute Teacher Certificate; Mary England Brown, who received her GED; Ruby Price, a mother of 14 children who has been community coordinator for Carey Arms for a number of years and sees that all children get to and from the school buses each day, who also coordinates all neighborhood activities with other volunteers including talent shows, neighborhood weekend barbeques and other activities: De Angela Win, who received her GED; Mary Schneider, who received her CNA; and Patricia Williams, who received her CNA Certificate.

The following are some comments made by these single parents to encourage others to seek higher ground:

McDowell: "A woman or man can do anything that they put their mind to. You must love

yourself, stay positive people. My mother was a good role model. She pulled herself up from welfare. She is now a Surgeon Technician. You can do it!"

Price: "Work hard and get yourself together before you have children. Have a goal and work towards that goal."

Green: "Put your mind into pulling yourself up. Never give up! Your children are watching

Brown: "You must feel better about yourself. When you do something to help yourself, you do feel better. Don't sit around waiting for welfare checks. You can and must take a stand. When you do, your kids know that they can too. Just do it!"

Williams: "I'm happy that someone took the time to recognize us. A lot of times the good that you do goes unnoticed and that should change.

Now many of the residents will want to pull themselves up. Do the best that you can. Try to get your education. I had an uphill battle with five children, high blood pressure, ulcers and hereditary respiratory asthma, and I did to. So can you!

Sometimes you don't have a strong family behind you Like I had, but if you try, there are a lot of people that will help you. Have faith in God and pull yourself up."
