LOS ANGELES, CAL. — It was standing-room only at the Second Annual A. Philip Randolph Messenger Awards presentation held during the recently concluded National Newspaper Publishers Association (NNPA) Convention in Los Angeles. Es-

July 2, 1908 - Thurgood Marshall, first black U.S. Supreme Court Justice is born.

July 3, 1962 - Jackie Robinson is named to the National Baseball Hall of Fame.

July 4, 1876 - E.M. Bannister African painter, exhibits "Under the Oaks" at the Centennial Exposition in Philadelphia and is awarded the gold medal.

July 5, 1975 - Authur Ashe Jr. wins the men's Wimbledon Singles Championship.

July 7, 1915 - Margeret Walker, writer is born.

July 8, 1965 - Roy Wilkens becomes executive director of NAACP.

July 9, 1893 - Dr. Daniel Hale Williams performs the worlds first successful open heart surgery without anesthesia.

July 10, 1937 - William (Bill) Cosby, Ed. D., entertainer is born.

July 13, 1965 - Thurgood Marshall is appointed first black solicitor general of the U.S.

July 14, 1891 - Inventor J. Standard is awarded a patent for his refrigerator.

July 15, 1779 - Pompey Lamb noted spy, aids the American Revolution war effort.

July 16, 1862 - Ida B. Wells, reformer who gathered first statistical records on lynchings in the U.S., is born.

July 17, 1953 - Jesse D. Locker appointed US Ambassador to Liberia.

July 19, 1925 - Josephine Baker, entertainer is greatly applauded at her Paris debut.

We just approved a gap...we lost track on a gap which is a trade treaty with 122 countries. That's important, he's going with that. He's going in with have passed the Senate and the House budget deficit reduction. Now countries can't complain about the United States not doing something to get the fiscal house in order. So, is he going to have the good luck of having Japan suddenly say, "our borders are open". The answer is no. Japan doesn't do business that way.

It's a very slow methodical process. I think the best way to do it is start clamping down on some of their goods that come here because if they don't have free trade, we shouldn't have free trade.

SAVOY: Do you think we are in a position to take that hard stand to tell them that?

REID: Yes, I think Mickey Tanner, our new trade representative, has done a pretty good job. He's already been tested with the European economic community. That's good.
