We just approved a gap...we lost track on a gap which is a trade treaty with 122 countries. That's important, he's going with that. He's going in with have passed the Senate and the House budget deficit reduction. Now countries can't complain about the United States not doing something to get the fiscal house in order. So, is he going to have the good luck of having Japan suddenly say, "our borders are open". The answer is no. Japan doesn't do business that way. It's a very slow methodical process. I think the best way to do it is start clamping down on some of their goods that come here because if they don't have free trade, we shouldn't have free

SAVOY: Do you think we are in a position to take that hard stand to tell them that?

REID: Yes, I think Mickey Tanner, our new trade representative, has done a pretty good job. He's already been tested with the European economic community. That's good.
