He engineered passage of an disparity study to aid minority business people in getting contracts with the city and with other local governments in the area.

By conceivable standards, Frank is in fact a key player in Las Vegas city government. He exerts as much influence on key decisions affecting Las Vegas as any councilman. How does he do it? Through the judicious application of his skills and an understanding of the game of politics.

On his part, The Hawk is a positive example for African-American politicians who become frustrated that their efforts are resisted by their fellow white politicians. Frank is the first to admit that his own political career isn't a bed of roses either. "There are times when I get frustrated and almost feel like giving up. When you're used to moving forward positively, you can sometimes take resistance to what you want as a personal insult, especially when you see deals being cut all around you," Hawkins said.

Visit Frank Hawkins Sports Lounge late at night and it's not unusual to see him sitting at the bar or in the corner poring over his city council agenda - preparing himself for the next meeting.

Frank makes no distinction between a gangbanger or the Governor. He respects everyone on a personal level. What more could we ask for in a public servant who knows how to use his power judiciously?
