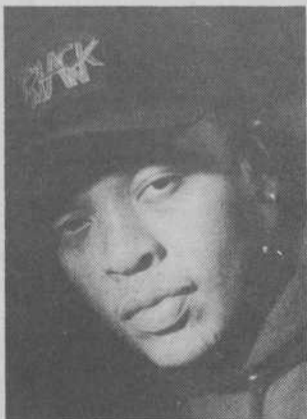

It was an out of court settlement for rap star Dr. Dre, whose real moniker is Andre Young, in a civil suit in which former Fox-TV rap talk show host Denise Barnes had accused the rapper of beating her in January 1991. The out of court settlement was a six figured sum, and came about one hour before the selection of a jury to hear this case. Dr. Dre had pleaded no contest

a year ago to criminal battery charges related to the incident and was fined \$2,500, and sentenced to 240 hours of community service plus 24 months probation. The judge had also required him to produce an anti-violence public service TV announcement. Now that things are settled, Dr. Dre and Ms. Barnes are expected to make a joint statement about the settlement at a press conference within a week or two according to sources close to both parties.

Oureast coast spies informed us that 100 of the world's best trumpeters paid tribute to the late Dizzy Gillespie the other Sunday during a "100 Trumpet Salute" at New Jersey's Haworth Shakespeare Festival. Motown Records' founder Berry Gordy was honored September 11th, when the Black Business Association presented him with their Lifetime Achievement Award at the organizations gala in Tinseltown. The following day at the Greek Theater, Stevie Wonder made a non musical appearance and received an award for his musical contributions at the "Rendez-vous In L.A." featuring French singers Veronique Sanson and Michel Jonasz.

Bertice also won an amateur comedy contest enroute to her present status as a 'talk show' host. Brown on the other hand was abandoned at birth, adopted and labeled 'educable mentally retarded.' He went on to become a

disc jockey, a three term Ohio State legislator, and owner of a Detroit based Motivational Speaking & Corporate Training Company, before becoming one of today's newest talk show

hosts. His talk show will air weekday's at 2:00 p.m. over KCAL-TV Channel 9, here in Tinseltownand that's Hollywood this time!! Until the next time, Lanier.

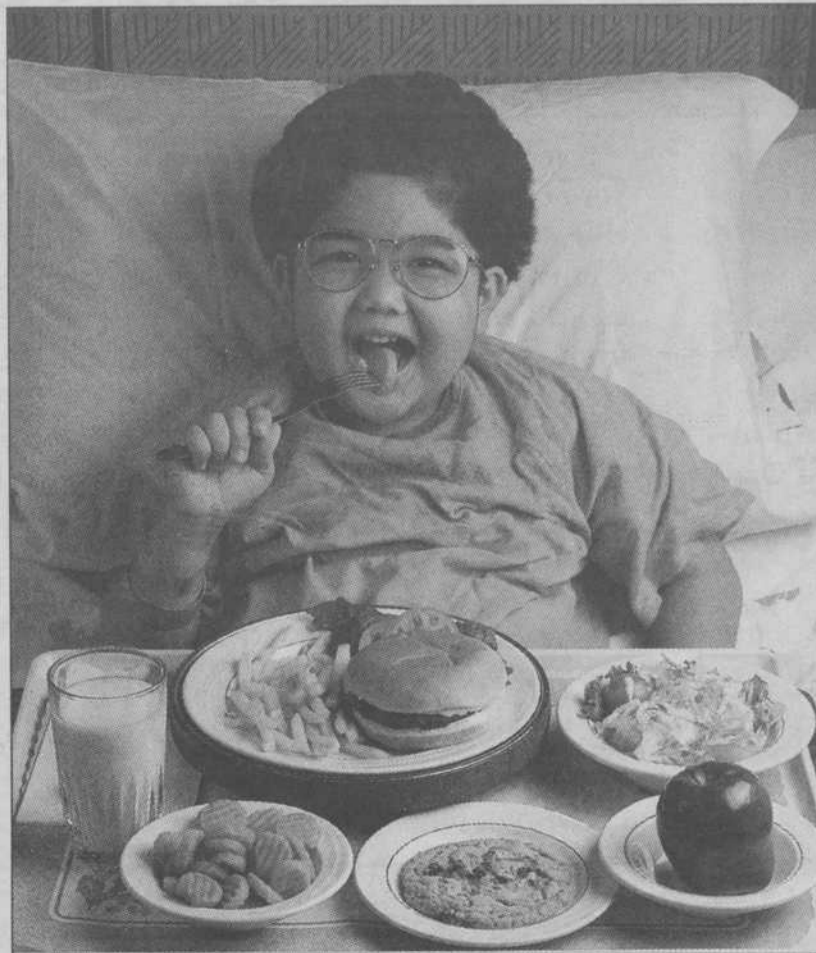
