LAS VEGAS- The University of Nevada, Las Vegas Department of Theater has set Andrew Lloyd Webber and Tim Rice's sensational rock musical "Jesus Christ Superstar" in a surrealistic world of the future.

The rock opera opens in Artemus W. Ham Hall Sept. 29 as part of the UNLV's University Theater 1993-94 season.

In this updated version that uses everyday language and contemporary music, we witness a loveless, violent, sexual world in need of the second coming of Christ. This electic musical is spiritually exalting in it's affirmation of love and humanity.

"Jesus Christ Superstar" will be directed by Robert Brewer. Brewer's lengthly credits include directing the celebrated production of "Death in Violence" for the San Francisco Opera, as well as directing such notables as Tony Award-winning Michael Rupert and Debbie Shapiro.

"I am interested in a contemporary vision of Christ. This is not the production at the Aladdin which played here last spring and, which I admired. It is darker, harder edged, more threatening. It is a world at the brink if Apocalypse, a world of high tech and little joy."

The creative team includes musical direction by Nick Rissman, and choreographer by Jacque Jaeger, video direction by Dean Minney, scenic design by Jeff Fiala, costume design by

Julie Engelvrecht and lighting design by Tony McCall.

Ed Barker plays Jesus, Jerry Schooler as Judas, with Melissa Supera as Mary, Paul Truckey as King Herold, and Glenn Peters as Pilate.

"Jesus Christ Superstar" tells the story of Jesus largely from Judas' point of view and has many overtones that relate to our own day.

Judas feelings about Jesus provide the real basis for the story line that links the musical numbers. Judas feels that he is trapped in a terrible role, one scripted by God and directed by Jesus.

Andrew Lloyd Webber and Tim Rice were only 23 and 26 years old respectively, when they wrote "Jesus Christ Superstar" which made them into superwriters and instant celebrities. They had been collaborating for five years.

They went on to collaborate on "Cats," and "Evita."

Rice and Webber brought "Jesus Christ Superstar" to MCA Records which decided to bring out the title song as a single. That led to the album. When the album first came out in England "it sunk like a stone." Eight days later, in the United States, "it tool off like a bullet," as it did in other countries.

Immediately, plans were made for Broadway production which had always been the authors' intention. They regarded






