On Sunday, Sept. 5, 1993 in Detroit, Michigan, Imam W. Deen Mohammed, Muslim Spokesman for Human Salvation, delivered a keynote speech at the Cobo Hall before nearly 10,000 Muslims and non-Muslim guests who traveled from all across America and from outside of the continent, culminating the Annual Islamic Convention.

The convention drew over 175 vendors from across the country who displayed numerous types of merchandise in booths including books, rugs, clothes, jewelry, tapes, etc. Other activities included nightly cultural affairs, over 44 workshops and seminars for adults and 30 or more which were conducted by the youth. Youth Leadership were in control and moderated their own banquet.


Imam W. Deen Mohammed discussed racism as not being the major problem facing African American people. In the following excerpts from his address he pointed out what should be the chief concerns of African Americans:

"One of the questions that we have to address is what can we do to heal these troubled cities and the miserable conditions that we find many of the people in. The miserable spiritual state of too many citizens. The miserable social condition of too many citizens. How can we make a contribution to the healing of these cities? We have been asked how do we address senseless violence? How do we address racial strife that should be no more a problem that would alarm the nation, after all of the work that has been done to bring about an acceptance in the European, Caucasian or white people for the African Americans or Black people and what has been done for the African American people to bring about an acceptance for white people.

So much has been done over the last twenty years, we would think that that old condition of racism in the people would not be so strong or so serious that it would not require national attention. I still believe, myself, that our most serious problem is not racism and the trouble of the evil that we find between the races or carried out by one race to the hurt or suffering of the other race.
