IMAM W. D. MOHAMMED ADDRESSES RACISM & OTHER ISSUES AT ANNUAL NATIONAL ISLAMIC CONVENTION

The following is Part II of excerpts from an address given by Imam W.D. Mohammed during the Annual National Islamic Convention in Detroit on Sept. 5, 1993.

"The way to heal is the way that has already been used to heal the wounds that we suffered from that ugly period in our nations history. We address the wrong doing, but we also should address the human person, the dignity of the human person and our great leaders like Frederick Douglas and even before him and many that followed him, down to Martin Luther King and others. They all did more that just point to the wrong that had been done, they did more than just seek punishment for the perpetrator- they did something better- they appealed to the human person. They sought to get more support from the human person in the society to stop such evils."

"These leaders pointed to the human person and appealed to the human person in such a way to make him or herself from the acts of the perpetrator - though that perpetrator be a member of their own race or that perpetrator be a member of their own family. They had a way of addressing the problem of race and race hatred, and racial violence that was inspired in them by God-and that is how we should address it today. We have to seek justice - especially when they are racial crimes - we have to appeal to the better conscience and better instincts of the citizens that allows that in order to get more human support against such wrongs. In time the civil rights movement and even movements that proceeded the civil rights movement, the Freedom Movement, in time those who were victims and those who were the victimizers gained supporters, gained in number, so many that pressure was brought to bear to make it's laws more equal, more just, and we came to realize a society that outlaws discrimination based on color and based on race, and equal opportunity for all of it's citizens. That was not an easy job, but that was accomplished. That was a great accomplishment for the victims as well as the families of those who were victimizing us, the white family.

These racial incidents that are happening should not cause us to (See Imam W. D. Mohammed, Page 23)
