BLUE JAYS TOP WHITE SOX RETURN TO WORLD SERIES

Tuesday night, at Comiskey Park, the Toronto Blue Jays topped the Chicago White Sox 6-3 to capture the American League Championship Series and advance to the World Series.

Behind a strong pitching performance of ALCS Most Valuable Player Dave Stewart, Toronto was able to capture the best-of-seven series, 4-2, and will now have a chance to become the first team since the New York Yankees to win consecutive World Series titles. The Yankees defeated the Los Angeles Dodgers in 1977 and '78 behind the slugging expertise of "Mr. October" Reggie Jackson.

"...I can share this with everyone," said Stewart, of his MVP trophy. "(Head Coach) Cito (Gaston) had a plan, and things worked out. I just feel fortunate enough to be in this situation."

The Blue Jays filled in the gaps, left by key players in their 1992 campaign such as: Dave Winfield and David Cone, with an Oakland connection in: Rickey Henderson and Stewart. Gaston acknowledged that following the Jays' victory.

"We lost a lot of players, that played a big role last year. We have been real lucky picking up some good baseball players.

I thought it'd be a pretty even matchup. They're a tough Chicago White Sox ball club."

Toronto couldn't have asked for anyone better to wrap up the ALCS on Tuesday night. Stewart came into the game 7-0

with a 1.99 ERA lifetime in ALCS games.

Stewart, 36, is now 8-0 in his last 10 playoff starts, and has had to face the opposition's No. 1 or No. 2 pitcher in every game.

PHILLIES END ATLANTA'S DRIVE

Wednesday night, in front of a frenzied Veterans Stadium crowd, the Philadelphia Phillies stopped the Atlanta Braves 6-3 to capture the National League Championship Series and advance to the World Series.

Behind a strong relief pitching effort of Mitch Williams, Philadelphia was able to capture the best-of-seven series, 4-2, and will now face the defending world champion Toronto Blue Jays. The Blue Jays are trying to become the first team since the New York Yankees defeated the Los Angeles Dodgers in 1977 and '78, and win consecutive World Series titles.

Philadelphia Phillies pitcher Curt Schilling was named Most Valuable Player for the NLCS, after turning in a 1.69 ERA for the series. In two games, Schilling struck out 19 batters over 16 innings, giving up only 3 earned runs.

Williams was actually the most predominant pitcher in all of the Phillies' victories, winning two and saving the other pair.

Wednesday evening, Williams made his entrance in the ninth inning, and sent the entire crowd into hysteria after retiring the side, as well as the NLCS. Williams ended the NLCS with a 1.69 ERA and five strikeouts.

After the win, Philadelphia Head Coach Jim Fregosi sat backandwatched his team erupt

Entering the game with just four hits in 20 at-bats, Borders connected for a two-run bases loaded single in the second to put the Blue jays on top. In the fourth he hit a go-ahead RBI fielder's choice, then proceded to double again in the sixth.

in jubilation in the infield. Fregosi said it was the team that deserved all the celebration.

FOR A RETURN TO FALL CLASS

"It's just been an amazing year for us," said Fregosi. "I'm real proud of this team."

The Phils ended Atlanta's goal of returning to the World Series for a rematch with the Toronto Blue Jays. The Braves have been the most exciting team in the majors the past few years with their amazing comebacks.

Two years ago, the Braves lost Games 4 and 5 of the NLCS at home to the Pittsburgh Pirates, traveled to Pennsylvania and stunned the Bucs twice. Then in the World Series, they battled back from a 2-0 deficit to the Minnesota Twins, to capture the lead 3-2. Atlanta ended up falling short in seven games.

Last year, after letting a 2-0 lead in the NLCS slip by, they upended the Pirates once again, this time in the bottom of the ninth in the seventh game.

This season Atlanta trailed San Francisco by 9-1/2 games in early August, stormed into first place, battled the giants down to the wire, and eventually won the NL West on the final regular season day.

Philadelphia has been on top from the beginning and basically was overshadowed by all the excitement in the other divisional races. The Phillies saw the Montreal Expos strive near the end of the season, but easily saw the NL East crown come their way.
