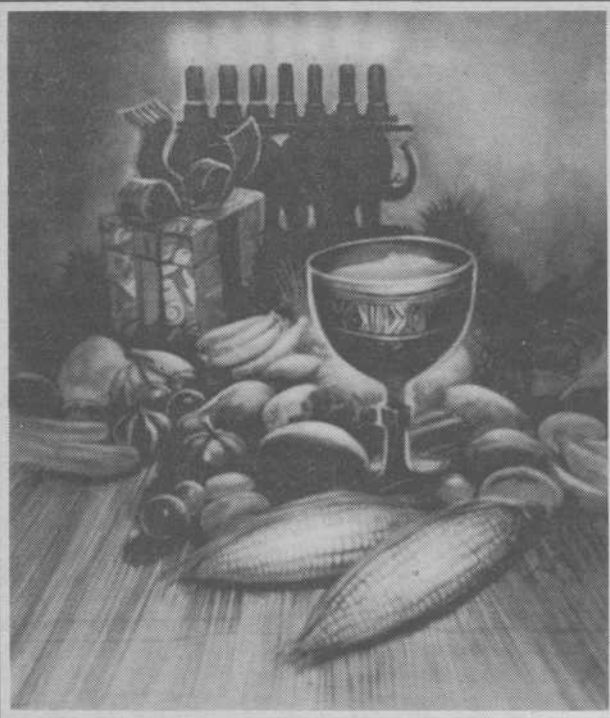


HOLIDAY GREETING CARDS RAISE FUNDS FOR THURGOOD MARSHALL SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM
