While Las Vegas Bowl II is now less than two months away, it is two rookie head coaches that have their football squads on a collision course for the December 17th meeting.

In the Big West Conference, it is Jeff Horton that is guiding the Wolfpack of Nevada in the league race, which happens to see first-year member Northern Illinois currently on top.

While NIU boasts a 3-1 BWC record, including a 46-42 victory over Nevada, it is the Wolfpack that is beginning to come on strong at mid-season. Horton, a

former UN assistant coach. succeeds Chris Ault, now the institution's Athletic Director.

Last week the Wolfpack got by pre-season favorite Utah State 48-44. Arguably, Nevada has the nation's top offensive player in quarterback Chris Vargas.

Vargas, last year's LV Bowl MVP, has already thrown for 2,515 yards and 20 touchdowns, while leading the country in total offense.

In the Mid-American Conference, Eastern Michigan has bolted out to a 4-2 record and is

one of three teams with a 3-0 mark in MAC play. Former UNLV and Notre Dame assistant Ron Cooper has seen his Eagles reel off four straight victories, after dropping the season's first two games.

EMU's most notable victory was a 28-21 win over pre-season favorite and arch-rival Central Michigan.

There are four conference matchups in each league, with

the additional four teams seeing non-conference action.

All four games in the BWC involve league leaders. Northern Illinois (4-3, 3-1 in the BWC) will host SW Louisiana (4-2, 1-1); Pre-season favorite Utah State (1-5, 1-1) will travel to UNLV (1-5, 0-1) for the Rebels' Homecoming; Louisiana Tech will play at San Jose State (1-5, 1-0); and New Mexico State (3-3, 2-1) will head to Pacific (1-5,

The top four teams in the MAC will square off in the two biggest games so far this season. Defending MAC and Las Vegas Bowl champion Bowling Green (4-2, 3-0 in the MAC) will travel to Ball State (4-2, 3-0); EMU (4-2, 3-0) will play host to westem-counterpart Western Michigan (3-3, 3-1); Central Michigan (2-5, 2-3) visits Kent (0-6, 0-4) and Ohio (1-6, 1-4) will

play at Miami of Ohio (2-4, 1-3). In non-conference games, Akron (3-3, 3-2) will hit the road

to meet the Temple Owls and Toledo (2-4, 1-3) will host Cincinnati.

Big West members Nevada (4-2, 2-1) and Arkansas State (1-6, 0-4) have dates with Weber State and Mississippi State respectively. The Wolfpack will be at home, while Arkansas State takes their show on the road.


