If I had my druthers, I wouldn't be writing a column on this particular subject. But everywhere I tum, whether I like it or not, I'm subtly and overtly reminded that race matters.

Our obsession with race is evidenced in many ways. The news is constantly full of racial innuendo. Census figures are broken down according to race. Affirmative Action offices of corporate America provide employee statistics broken down by racial category. Birth certificates make note of an individual's racial ancestry. And on, and on and on.

If race didn't matter, why would it play such a significant role in our everyday lives? Why would racial conflict be such a major focus on local, national and global news and information?

When I turn on the local radio news, I'm consistently told the race of the suspect of a crime

when that person is Black, but only some of the time when the perpetrator of the crime happens to be white.

Why does media differentiate race in such a selective manner? It's as if they were keeping a racial score card seemingly to gloat "This crime was committed by One of Them, wouldn't you know it!"

Given the pattern for singling out criminals on the basis of race, designating a criminal suspect as Black becomes an automatic part of the description provided.

How many Black men fit the description, for example, of being 5' 7" tall, 20 to 25 years old 160 pounds with closely cropped hair? Such a description certainly wouldn't help to capture a suspect. It could, however, lead to the arrest or detainment of many Black men fitting such an open description.
