Earlier this week, the Green Valley Gators were forced to hand back two victories (Boulder City and Las Vegas) due to academic ineligibility of a certain player who transferred from the state of Pennsylvania. Before the forfeitures, the Gators were 4-2 in division play and in position, with Chaparral's help, to earn a playoff spot this week. As it stands now, G.V.H.S. is 2-4 in division play and 3-5 overall and near the bottom of the standings.

An appeal has been filed by Green Valley's Athletic Administration and will not be heard by the school district until November 9.

In more sporty news from the High School Football world, Clark remained on pace for an undefeated season with an ugly 62-6 waxing of Durango. Phil Glover led the Chargers' offense with 177 yards on just seven carries and 2 TDs. Clark QB Jay Snowden threw for two other TDs in helping Clark move to 5-0 in the Sunset Division

and 7-0 overall. The one thing that I can say in favor of Durango, is that even though they have yet to win a game, and have the smallest lineup in town, they have great fans.
