DANCE THEATER TO PRESENT ANNUAL "NUTCRACKER"

OF THE HOLIDAY CLASSIC

Nevada Dance Theatercelebrates the holiday season with the magic of The Nutcracker on December 16-30, 1993 at the Judy Bayley Theater on the UNLV Campus. With an annual audience of nearly 10,000 people, Nevada Dance Theater's production of The Nutcracker is one of the most popular holiday events in Southern Nevada. Featuring choreography by NDT Artistic Director and Founder Vassili Sulich, and with the cherished Tchaikosky score, this ballet is yuletide entertainment for the entire family.

The company will stage 17 performances of The Nutcracker at Judy Bayley Theater, including 5 matinees. In addition, the company will tour to Flagstaff, Arizona on December 10, 11, 12 for three full performances and one of Act II. Tickets are \$13. \$20, \$24 and \$30, available at the UNLV Performing Arts Center Box Office. Children (3-12) and seniors (62 and older) receive special rates of \$11, \$19, \$22, and \$28. Groups of 10 or more people qualify for the group rate of \$10 per person.

Traditionally, children have been a vital part of The Nutcracker, and this year there will be more than 75 young people from the NDT Youth Company participating in the Company's production. They will perform in such roles as Clara and Fitz, toy soldiers, gingersnaps, reindeer, and party children.

In conjunction with The Nutcracker, a Snowflake Tea will be held on Saturday, December 18 at Noon at the Artemus Ham Hall Lobby. Held prior to the matinee, this event includes a festive afternoon lunch, holiday music and door prizes. Entertainment will follow, with the Academy children performing an exerpt from the ballet, Stephanie Moore Myers reading the story of The Nutcracker and actor David Dekker narrating Dickens' "The Christmas Carol." The Snowflake Tea, sponsored by the Nevada Dance Theater Guild, is a benefit for Nevada Dance Theater. Tickets are \$10 and can be obtained by calling (702) 732-3838.
