Health.

The study included 2,955 women 65 years and older who were examined in 1989 and 1990 as part of the Cardiovascular Health Study, an investigation of risk factors for coronary heart disease and stroke in the elderly.

Manolio says women who take estrogen generally are more health conscious, better educated and thinner than women who don't take it. They also tend

to smoke less and have lower blood pressure and blood cholesterol.

"In lots of ways, women who take estrogen are different from women who don't," says Manolio, "so we have to correct for that when we try to figure out whether estrogen's effect is over and above the differences in risk factors."

The risk factor associations with carotid thickening uncovered by the new study represent "the first demonstration of these

relationships in a large cohort of older women," Manolio and her colleagues note in their report. Why has it taken so long for scientists to focus on older women? "Post-menopausal women haven't been taking estrogen long enough to provide large samples of women above age 70 or 75," explains Manolio.

Although a recent study in southern California had a large sample of elderly women, "it's risk factor information was based entirely on questionaires" without any laboratory tests or measurements of atherosclerosis, she says.

The new study includes non-invasive measurements of the carotid arteries and the main pumping chamber of the heart, as well as several laboratory studies. In "ultrasound" exams, Manolio's team found after accounting for other differences that the women with thicker walls in their carotids tended to be those not taking estrogen, while four percent thinner walls were associated with estrogen use.

Laboratory tests suggested estrogen use lowers the risk of arterial wall thickening by lowering the level of LDL (low density lipoprotein) cholesterol. Because high levels are associated with hardening and thickening of arteries, LDL is often called the "bad" cholesterol.

The women in the study were recruited from a random sample of Medicare eligibility lists in four U.S. communities: Forsyth County, N.C.; Sacramento County, Calif.; Washington County, Md.; and Pittsburgh (Allegheny County), Pa.

Of the 2,955 participants, 281 were taking "unopposed" (without progesterone) estrogen and 77 were using estrogen plus progesterone. An additional 774 women reported part use of

hormones but did not have current prescriptions.

Estrogen was more common in women with a prior hysterectemy, the surgical removal of the uterus, the scientists report. Other studies have shown that use of unopposed estrogen increases the risk of cancer of the endometrium, the inner lining of the uterus.

But Manolio says in older women the risk of cardiovascular disease, including heart attack and stroke, far outweighs the risk of endometrial cancer. She cautions that women now on estrogen replacement therapy should not change their medication without consulting their physician.

Menopause, or end of menstruation, occurs naturally in most women between the ages of 45 and 55. Menopause reflects a gradual decrease in production by the ovaries of the hormones estrogen and progesterone. Progestin is the synthetic form of progesterone.

Until menopause, women generally are protected from cardiovascular disease, and many researchers believe it's estrogen that provides this protection.

"People tend to think of heart disease as a man's disease," notes Manolio, "But it's also very much an older women's disease."
