pointed at Rollie. Others are concerned about the lack of big men in the frontcourt. Highly recruited Clayton Johnson is after a season-ending injury which leaves Patrick Savoy and Kebu Stewart with all the banging inside.

One thing that isn't helping is the lack of team support from the community. An "unannounced" crowd of 6,944 were in attendance for Monday's debacle, and it doesn't exactly look promising as the season progresses.

The 'Rebels' five-game homestand saw at least 8,300 fans attend the first four games. Monday's contest figured to attract at least 10,000 people due to ESPN and the Atlantic Coast Conference invading town.

UNLV's remaining home schedule consists of Big West opponents, which over the years has dropped off the "things to do list" for the family.

This Saturday UNLV travels to Georgetown to face John Thompson's unranked Hoyas. It'll be the first road game on the East Coast, as well as the Big East, for Coach Mass since taking over the squad last season.

Georgetown holds a 5-2 record against the Rebels in this series and will be a big favorite this Saturday when the two tip-off.

One thing that needs to happen is that UNLV must remain focused. Coach Mass and Co. can't be worried about what the fans are thinking.

The community is just reacting towards something that hasn't happened very often in this town. If the crowd is able to see that they're getting to Coach Mass, they will continue to antagonize him.

It is up to the team to cogitate and get through the tough times in order to come out ahead.

It would be sad to see the Rebels no longer be an attraction for fans to see.
