It is difficult to appreciate being well dressed going into a department store and having all of the store security personnel follow you around, because you are an African "...everyone knows that Africans steal things like stealing America from Native Americans.

It is difficult to understand the experience of being 5 or 6 years old and watching your grandmother verbally dissect a European for referring to you and your sister as "cute little pickaninnies".

It is difficult for a European to understand this small sample of the hourly, daily, weekly experiences of Africans living in Amerca. There are however some things from a human perspective that one has to take on faith without actually having experienced them. If indeed an entire group of people are angry over the same thing. I believe that entire group of people are impatient because

of the same problem. If an entire group of people seem to be more hostile because of the same problem, perhaps the fault lies in the problem and not in the people. It is difficult to conceive of an entire group of people, a geological group of people as are Africans in this country, as being paranoid or schizophrenic. It is up to our European friends therefore to understand this lack of patience. If indeed they are to be our friends, they must participate in the destruction of the system that creates the lack of patience. I am sure therefore that my European friends will understand my attitude that we cannot, we will not, and we must not wait one second longer.
