12TH ANNUAL ARTISTS' SALUTE TO BLACK HISTORY MONTH

The twelfth Annual Artists' salute to Black History Month, the largest annual exhibition of fine art by artists of African descent, will be held Wednesday, February 2nd through Sunday, February 6, 1994 during regular mall hours, at the Baldwin Hills Crenshaw Plaza, located at Crenshaw and Martin Luther King, Jr. Boulevards in Los Angeles. The exhibition theme for the Twelfth Annual Artists' Salute is "Our Children . . . Our Hope." Admission is free.

On the first and second levels of the Baldwin Hills Crenshaw Plaza will be thousands of art works created by over 150 participating artists from 22 states. Included in this exhibition will be original, limited edition and open end edition paintings, graphics, photography, masks, sculpture, batiks, ceramics, stained glass, mixed media, portrait artists and wearable art.

Master artists Jacob Lawrence and Gwendolyn Knight will receive special awards at the invitational opening reception for this exhibition. Mr. Lawrence will receive the Charles White Lifetime Achievement Award and Ms. Knight will receive the Pioneer Award. Jacob Lawrence and Gwendolyn Knight will speak to the public on Wednesday, February 2nd from 7:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. at the Baldwin Hills Crenshaw Plaza in the Children's Gallery located on the first level of the plaza near the Broadway. TIME MACHINE WITH JACK PERKINS

THE BUFFALO SOLDIERS: THE LEGEND CONTINUES

TIME MACHINE WITH JACK PERKINS presents a historical overview of the Black Brigade, Buffalo Soldiers, chronicling their heroic contributions in every war since their units were formed more than 127 years ago. This enlightening documentary bridges the 19th and 20th centuries, beginning with the time that escaped slaves fled to the Seminole Indian territory and became scouts for the U.S. Cavalry in the West. During World War I, the Buffalo Soldier units spent all of

their time on the Mexican border. However, these Buffalo Soldier units were separated during World War II due to the segregation policies set forth by the United States Armed Forces. During the Korean War, the 24th Infantry was the last of those four original regiments. They fled the scene and dishonored their regimental colors, earning the title of "The Bug-out Brigade." Black historians and military researchers have worked to re-
