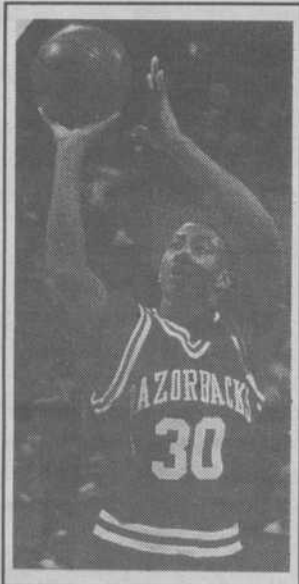

Stoudamire is the natural leader and the team's best outside shooter while Reeves years for the one-on-one break. Sophomore Reggie Geary compliments the backcourt for the Wildcats, adding plenty of athleticism and defensive skills.

While both tout outstanding guards, it is the Razorbacks that will look to 6-7 250 lb. sophomore forward Carliss Williamson as their go-to-guy. He leads Arkansas with a 20.3 scoring average and 7.5 rebounds a game. His strength and power comes from his astounding agility, making him very difficult to play against.

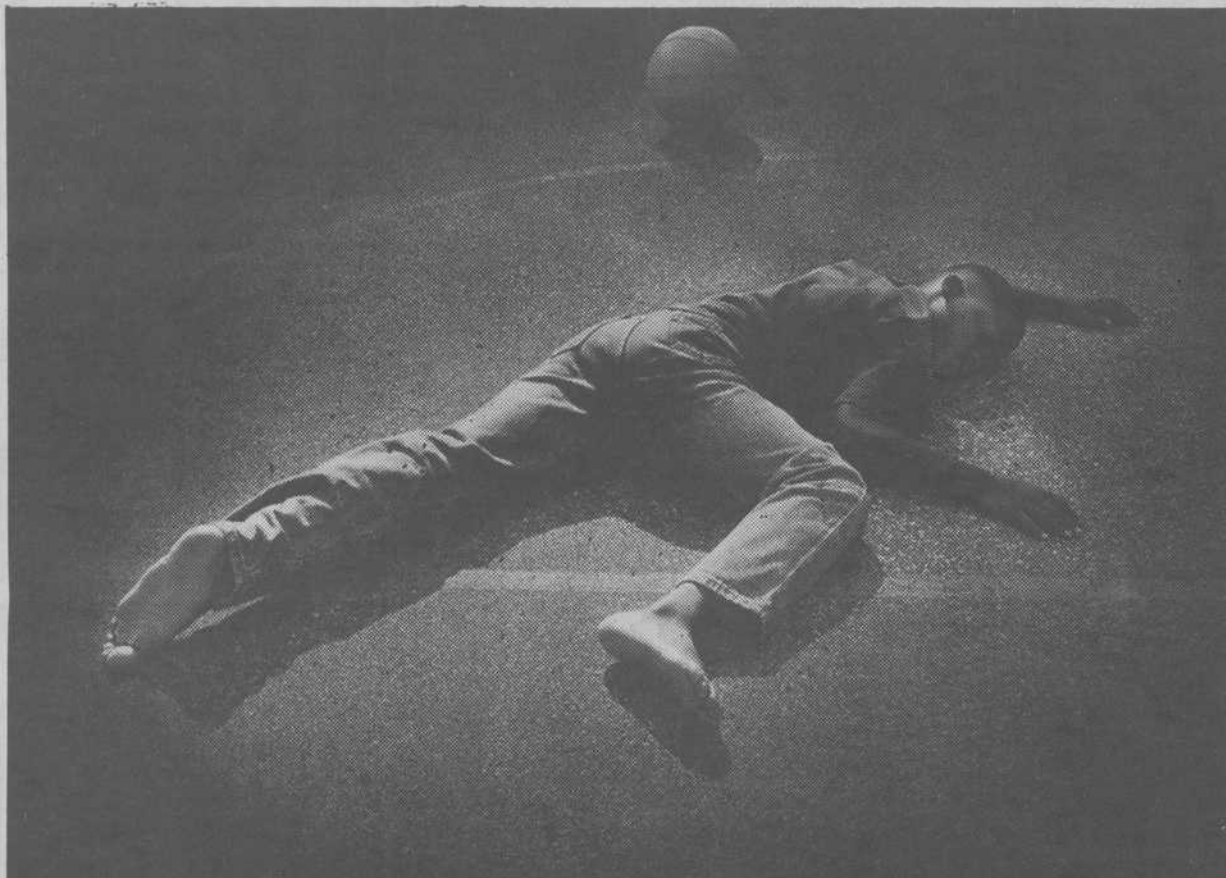
Arizona has been exceptional on defense so far in the tournament, allowing their four opponents a mere 32.9 shooting percentage overall and a slim 28.4 percent from 3-pt. range.

The game could see plenty of lead changes, and likely will stay within a 3-5 pt. lead range.

As long as the 'Cats aren't looking to shut down a center, Geary will get the call as their defensive specialist for the game, and in Saturday's case, it'll be interesting to see who he can antagonize more - Thurman or Williamson. Forward Ray Ows and center Joseph Blair adds the strength that Arizona needs in the paint.

OUTLOOK: As mentioned, the lead will change in multiple amounts of time. The difference in this game will be who can control the tempo. Arizona may be more honed than Arkansas for this type of clash, but don't count Nolan Richardson out just yet. Both he and Olsen have their best shot at making the National Championship game, and will be clawing for the victory. Not only will a tempo need to be maintained but fouls will need to be limited. If Williamson falls in a groove he is capable of doing, Ows and Blair will get their fouls.

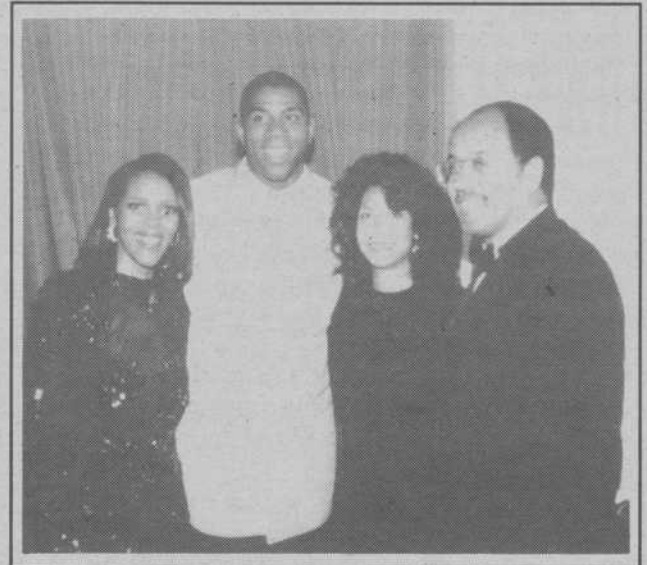
