(Continued from Page 7) tional 1993 taxes in three equal installments. You must make this election of your 1993 income tax return by filing Form 8841.

The first payment is due April 15 (or for fiscal-year taxpayers, the initial due date of their income tax returns), with the second and third instalments due on April 15 of each succeeding year. This will apply if you end up getting a refund on your 1993 tax return.

No interest or underpayment of estimated tax penalty will be charged if you pay the taxes attributable to the retroactive rate increase on this installment basis. WHEN THE GOVERNMENT OWES YOU MONEY

If you are expecting a tax refund, keep in mind that the IRS has 45 days from the later of the original due date of your tax return of the date you actually file the return to issue you a refund and does not need to pay you interest on the refund amount. Different rules apply to amended returns.

can Dematologist and its only Board Certified female Dermatologist. When she discusses her trade, she shows an exuberance to solve the skin disorders of her patients. "The skin is one of the best ways to discover many internal illness that patients may have. It can be a window to the inside of the body," states McDonald. Dermatology is the medical and surgical treatment of disorders of skin, nails, and hair. It has been erroneously underplay as merely the field which treats the occasional pimple that an adolescent might get during puberty.

The African American community has uniquely ethnic skin problems, according to McDonald. Black skin discolors easier and is more sensitive to injury than white skin. McDonald says it is very important for people to seek the guidance of a dermatologist when they notice unusual blemishes or changes in their skin. These blemishes, according to McDonald, could be a sign of serious skin diseases such as skin cancer, eczema, and psoriasis - all of which, in blacks, can cause permanent skin discoloration and unsightly scars. She admits that skin cancer is not highly prevalent in the African American community, however, other more prevalent skin diseases warrant periodic check ups with the dermatologist.

One of the most distressful ethnic skin disorders is the keloid. The keloid is defined as an area of scar tissue which, for some reason, continues to thicken and grow beyond the original area of injury. It can develop as a response to injuries such as the following: ear lobe piercing, vaccination, surgery, and even acne. They commonly appear as disfiguring masses on the ear lobes of women or men after an ear is pierced. Dr. McDonald says the disorders can be treated through periodic cortisone injections or surgery.

She notes the difficulty that some doctors have encountered in treating the uniquely ethnic disorder. "In medical school, one wise instructor told me that if you could treat black skin disorders then you are prepared to treat any type of skin disorder, since black skin is in many ways the most difficult skin to understand stated the doctor regarding complications found in black skin. Furthermore, some disorders are more prevalent among blacks such as chemically induced hair loss, razor bumps, sarcoidosis and acne keloidalis nuchae (nodules on the back of the scalp.)

"Most physicians receive little formal training on disorders prevalent among blacks," stated the doctor. McDonald especially relishes in the successful restoration of hair loss among African Americans. Proper treatment and follow-up says McDonald is the key to restoration. This announcement brought the disease home to the heterosexual community. Recent statistics note declining numbers for homosexuals and those actively practicing a bi-sexual lifestyle, yet the numbers also indicate the heterosexual community's reluctance to practice preventative measures. Teenagers and women have had significant increases in acquiring the disease. Researchers blame the promiscuity of the teenage lifestyle, but are more

alarmed with women's statistics. Women have the greatest potential to pass the disease into the heterosexual community, according to researchers. Women are expected to pass men in their infection rates by the year 2000.

Time Magazine chronicled the disease as a "Decade of Death" in its August of 1992 issue. The outlook wasn't presented favorably towards finding a cure. It has baffled some of the world's greatest scientific minds as they search and compile hypotheses to combat the ailment. The disease in 1981

originally existed in a microcosm, found in hamlets of San Francisco, California. It was an unusual type of immune-system failure among gay men. Similar cases, however poorly documented, existed in parts of central Africa for some time previous.

Hemophiliacs were put into high risk groups in 1982. Two years elapsed before the heterosexual community was threatened when two women contracted the disease from infected sexual partners. World wide hysteria resulted as people reacted to the disease, avoiding

those who were infected, and bashing the gay community for its scourge upon humanity. It wasn't until 1985 that a measurable test was developed for detection. In 1992, the 8th International AIDS conference in Amsterdam announced it was no closer to finding a cure than 10 years ago when the fatal illness was first discovered.

This to the dismay of the estimated 30 million people to be afflicted with the disease world wide by the year 2000. A conservative estimate, some predict the number will be as high as 110 million.
