

UNLV TO OFFER MASTER'S DEGREE IN CRIMINAL JUSTICE

Beginning this fall, UNLV will offer a master's degree in criminal justice.

The two-year master of arts program will prepare students to pursue careers in criminal justice research, policy-making, administration, and teaching. It will also prepare them to pursue doctoral degrees in criminal justice or in other social or behavioral sciences.

"It's a program that emphasizes an understanding of causes of crime and of factors that influence the development and implementation of laws to deal with crime," said criminal justice professor Ronald Farrell, director of the graduate program.

"An understanding of these issues is essential to sound social policy in criminal justice," he said. The program will place a strong emphasis on criminal

justice theory and on research methods," he added.

"There's a great need for such a program in Las Vegas," Farrell said. "This is a growing community and, like many other urban areas, it faces growing concerns about crime control."

Applications for admission for the fall semester are due July 1. One of the requirements for admission is a 3.0 grade point average. Farrell said he expects that most successful applicants will have undergraduate degrees in one of the social or behavioral sciences or in public administration.

NEW YORK — The United Negro College Fund reached a milestone in its \$250-million capital campaign: CAMPAIGN 2000: An Investment in America's future having raised a total of just over \$200 million in gifts and pledges. UNCF's President and CEO, William H. Gray, III hailed this breakthrough. "Education has long been a stepping stone to a better life for our youth. We appreciate the commitment our benefactors from the corporate and philan-

thropic world have made to the UNCF institutions which are preparing these young people for global competition," stated Mr. Gray. The \$200 million total represents nearly one-quarter of the almost \$900 million UNCF has raised since its inception in 1944.

A successful conclusion to CAMPAIGN 2000 in UNCF's Golden Anniversary Year is crucial to addressing the needs of the College Fund's member colleges and universities. As

Mr. Gray continued, "Without the adequate education and active participation of all our citizens, America's prosperity and standing in the world's increasingly complex and competitive marketplace will falter. Only with ample resources will our colleges and universities continue to produce the college-educated workers America will need in the next fifty years—and beyond."
