ated with a college education. Students 12-20 years of age, or in their junior year in college, were eligible for the sweepstakes. Since Kevin is a high school junior, the \$10,000 will be placed in an interest-bearing trust fund which will be available for him upon his acceptance by an accredited four-year college or university of his choice. The \$10,000 is not transferable and will be payable to the college in Kevin's name.

"Like most parents, we were concerned about the money needed to pay for Kevin's education," said Gerald Coles, Kevin's father. "Knowing we have a \$10,000 base to build on is almost to good to be true. The

Kevin currently attends Crossland High School, Camp Springs, MD, and is a member of the school's ROTC program. He plans to attend a historically black college and major in accounting and then pursue a career as a stock broker.

"Receiving \$10,000 toward my college education means quite a bit to me," said Kevin. "It's becoming almost impossible to compete for good jobs with only a high school education. Because of encouragement from my parents, I've become more serious about college than I've ever been."




