## "WORLD DRUM AND DANCE SUMMIT COMES TO ATLANTA..."

The Atlanta Committee for the Olympic Games (ACOG) Cultural Olympiad, in conjunction with the Atlanta-based Dancers Collective and Institute for the Study of African Culture, will bring top African percussionists and choreographers to Atlanta for the 1994 World Drum and Dance Summit, August 1st through August 7th, at Clark Atlanta University.

Under the direction of worldrenowned percussionist Mor Thiam, the intensive week-long program of workshops and masterclasses—open to professional and semiprofessional practitioners—will be led by 8 internationally recognized African and African-American choreographer and percussionists including Biza Sompa, Titos Sompa, Louisnes Louisnis, Naomi Diouf, Zak Diouf, Chuck Davis and Mar Gueye.

A complement to the 1994 Atlanta Summer Dance Institute—a collaboration between the Cultural Olympiad and Dancers Collective—the 1994 World Drum and Dance Summit will be presented during the Cultural Olympiad's "Celebrate Africal", a ten-day city-wide celebration of African cultural life that is part of the 1994 National Black Arts Festival. Mor Thiam and his group Drums of Fire will also perform during "Celebrate Africa!"

"I think we've created a unique opportunity for dancers and musicians in the region to gain real insights into the art forms of African dance and drumming," said Stephanie Hughley, Theatre and Dance Producer for the Cultural Olympiad. "The faculty Mor Thiam has assembled brings to Atlanta expertise in a huge array of African styles, including Congolese, Senegalese, Haitian, Liberian, traditional African dance and

drumming

The workshops are open to dancers who have at least two years of African dance training, and advanced percussionist. Separate dance classes will be held for children ages 4 and up. Fees are \$10.00 for individual adult drumming and dance classes, and \$5.00 for individual children's dance classes. Unlimited-class passes are \$100.00 for adults and \$25.00 for children.

The World Drum and Dance Summit was formed in 1985 at Southern Illinois University by the Institute for the Study of African Culture and the Conservatory School for Arts in St. Louis, Missouri, as a vehicle to showcase the talents of student and professional drummers and dancers of all cultures.

Dancers Collective is a nonprofit presenting organization serving the Metro Atlanta area. Through symposia, workshops, master classes, performances, and lecture-demonstrations, Dancers Collective seeks to educate, entertain, and stimulate the Atlanta community.

ACOG's Cultural Olympiad is a multi-year festival of the arts, culture, and entertainment that culminates in the Olympic Arts Festival in the summer of 1996. Using the unprecedented opportunity of the Centennial Olympic Games, the Cultural Olympiad aims to bring to international attention the rich cultural and artistic life of the American South, while at the same time bringing to the region the best in international art and culture. 
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
