HERSHEY'S TRACK & FIELD YOUTH PROGRAM

The City of Las Vegas Department of Parks and Leisure Activities will once again host the Regional Qualifying Meet for the Hershey's National Track and Field Youth Program. This year's contest is scheduled for Wednesday, June 22 at 6 p.m., with registration being accepted from 5-5:45 p.m. Taking place at the new Las Vegas High School, 6800 E. Sahara Ave., at Hollywood Blvd., competition is open to all boys and girls from 9-14 years of age.

Athletes are divided into age categories and compete within that Division. Ages divisions include 9 and 10, 11 and 12, and 13 and 14 year olds. Events include the 50, 100, 200, 400, 800, and 1600 meter dashes; (depending on age) the 4x100 meter relay, the standing long jump, and the softball throw. Within each age group, boys will compete against, and girls against girls. Contestants may enter up to three events which must include one track event and one field event. Participating on a relay team is considered a track event.

Times and distances will be recorded and compared with those of California, Hawaii, Utah and Arizona a regional team will be selected. The State of Nevada will have at least five persons on that team. These winners will receive an all expense paid trip to Hershey, Pennsylvania to participate in the finals meet.

CLEM ROBINSON, PURDUE
Forward, Ht. 6-8, Wt. 225

Early entry candidate for 1994 NBA Draft...Consensus national Player of the Year and First Team All-America...Named Player of the Year by AP, UPI, The Sporting News, Basketball Times, Basketball Weekly, USBWA and as the recipient of the John Wooden Award...First national Player of the Year from Purdue since coaching legend John Wooden in 1932...Led nation in scoring in 1993-94 with 30.3 ppg...First player to lead Big Ten in scoring and rebounding (10.1) since Mychal Thompson in 1978...Only 15th NCAA player to score 1,000 points in a season with 1,030 in 1993-94...Scored 30 or more points 18 times last season, and compiled 18 double-doubles...Led Purdue in scoring in 56 of his 62 career games...Averaged 24.1 points (ninth in nation) and 9.2 rebounds as a junior.

Guard, Ht. 6-4, Wt. 205

Early entry candidate for 1994 NBA Draft...Named First Team All-America by Associated Press as a sophomore...Named Pac-10 Player of the Year...Led nation in assists in 1993-94 with 9.1 per game...Fourth in nation in steals with 3.1 per game...Captured California's career record for steals in only two seasons with 204...Led Pac-10 in assists and steals both seasons...First sophomore ever to win Pac-10 Player of the Year honors...As a senior, averaged 16.7 points and 6.9 rebounds...Set Cal and Pac-10 record with 18 assists at Stanford...Career-high is 27 points against Santa Clara...Tied Cal record with seven three-pointers against Washington State...Shot .533 from three-point range in college career...Was Pac-10 Freshman of the Year in 1992-93.

Forward/Guard, Ht. 6-8, Wt. 225

Unanimous 1994 First Team All-America selection...Three-time All-America pick...Played on NCAA National Championship Teams in 1991 and 1992 and guided Duke to 1994 NCAA title game...The first player in ACC history with 1,900 points, 700 rebounds, 400 assists, 200 steals and 100 blocked shots in a career...Eighth player in Duke history to have his number (#33) retired...The 1994 ACC Player of the Year after averaging team-leading 17.4 points and 5.2 assists, adding 6.9 rebounds...First Team All-ACC junior and senior years...As a junior, won Henry Iba Corinthian Award as nation's top defensive player...Son of former NFL star Calvin Hill, now a Vice President of the Baltimore Orioles.

Forward, Ht. 6-9, Wt. 210

Early entry candidate for 1994 NBA Draft...A consensus First Team All-America selection and runnerup to Purdue's Glenn Robinson in most national Player of the Year balloting...Ranks sixth on UConn's all-time scoring list with 1,648 points...All-time top shot blocker at UConn with 245 blocks (2.7 bpg)...Set team single-season records for points (855), field goals (307), free throws (200) and blocked shots (111)... Unanimous selection as 1993-94 Big East Conference Player of the Year...Set Big East record with 462 points this season in league play...Led UConn to Big East regular season title with 16-2 mark and two wins in 1994 NCAA Tournament to reach Sweet Sixteen...Scored career-high 42 points twice, both against St. John's at Madison Square Garden.

JUAN HOWARD, MICHIGAN
Forward/Center, Ht. 6-8, Wt. 250

Early entry candidate for 1994 NBA Draft...Named Third Team All-America by Associated Press following junior season...One of five players in Michigan history to score 1,500 points and grab 700 rebounds...Ranks eighth all-time at Michigan in rebounds (745) and is 10th in points (1,526)...Ranks ninth in career NCAA Tournament scoring with 280 points and is tied for first in games played with 16... Named Most Outstanding Player of the 1994 NCAA Midwest Regional after averaging 29 points and 12.8 rebounds in four games...Had career-high 34 points and season-high 18 rebounds vs. Texas to propel Michigan to NCAA Sweet Sixteen...In final collegiate game of season, had 30 points and 13 rebounds vs. eventual NCAA Champion Arkansas.

SHARONE WRIGHT, CLEMSON
Center, Ht. 6-11, Wt. 260

Early entry candidate for 1994 NBA Draft...Named Honorable Mention All-America by Associated Press as a junior...Grabbed 903 rebounds at Clemson, trailing only Tree Rollins, Dale Davis and Horace Grant, all of whom played four college seasons...Also ranks 12th at Clemson with 1,308 points...Only player in ACC to average a double-double each of past two seasons...Had 18 double-doubles as a junior and 39 in his career...Was 15th in nation in blocked shots (2.9 bpg) and 19th in rebounding (10.6 rpg)...As a sophomore, averaged 4.1 blocks per game, second in nation...Tough position defender...Top game last season came against Oklahoma State and seven-footer Bryant Reeves when he tallied 25 points, 13 rebounds and seven blocked shots.

Forward, Ht. 6-7, Wt. 220

Early entry candidate for 1994 NBA Draft...Named Third Team All-America by Associated Press as a junior...Became Cal's all-time leading scorer (1,688 points) in just three seasons...Led Pac-10 in scoring with 24.3 ppg, which set Cal records for scoring average and total points (729)...Also led Cal in rebounding as a junior with 7.9 and blocked 31 shots in 30 games...Scored 38 points at Washington State, and tallied 36 in upset win over UCLA...Two-time First Team All-Pac-10...Third at Cal in career three-pointers with 99...Shot 34 percent from three-point range for career...Played for Team USA last summer in five-game tour vs. European teams...First cousin of Portland's Tracy Murray.

Forward, Ht. 6-9, Wt. 254

Named to All-Tournament Team at Phoenix Desert Classic after averaging 15.3 points and Classic-leading 14.0 rebounds in three games...Named Midwestern Collegiate Conference Player of the Year his final two seasons at Xavier...Led Xavier in rebounding four straight years...Finished career at Xavier's sixth all-time leading scorer (1,719), third all-time leading rebounder (1,080) and second all-time shotblocker (127). Averaged 16.7 points and 9.9 rebounds as a senior, shooting career-best .713 from free throw line...Aggressive player who makes few mistakes...Led MCC in field goal percentage at 56 percent.

Helped Tar Heels to NCAA title as a junior...Two-time selection to Associated Press All-America Second Team...Ranks fourth in North Carolina history with 169 blocked shots, and is sixth in rebounding with 941...Shot .585 from field for collegiate career and averaged 11.7 points and 6.8 rebounds for balanced North Carolina attack... Played on U.S. developmental squad that faced original Dream Team prior to 1992 Summer Olympic Games...Enjoyed 25-point, 17-rebound effort in victory over Clemson...Led team in field goal percentage for three years...Named to All-ACC First Team as a junior, Second Team as a senior.

Named Honorable Mention All-America by Associated Press as a senior...Scored 1,470 points in three years to become 13th-leading scorer in Temple history...Named Atlantic 10 Conference Player of the Year after averaging 19.2 points, 6.8 rebounds and 2.3 steals as a senior...Shot 35 percent from three-point range...Had career-high 30 points against Cincinnati and Rutgers...Named A-10 Player of the Week three times as a senior...First player in Temple history with 100 assists and 100 blocked shots in a career...Played for gold medal-winning Team USA at the Under-22 World Championships prior to his senior season...Capped collegiate career with 24 points against Indiana in NCAA Tournament.
