**"TINSELTOWN TOPICS...."**

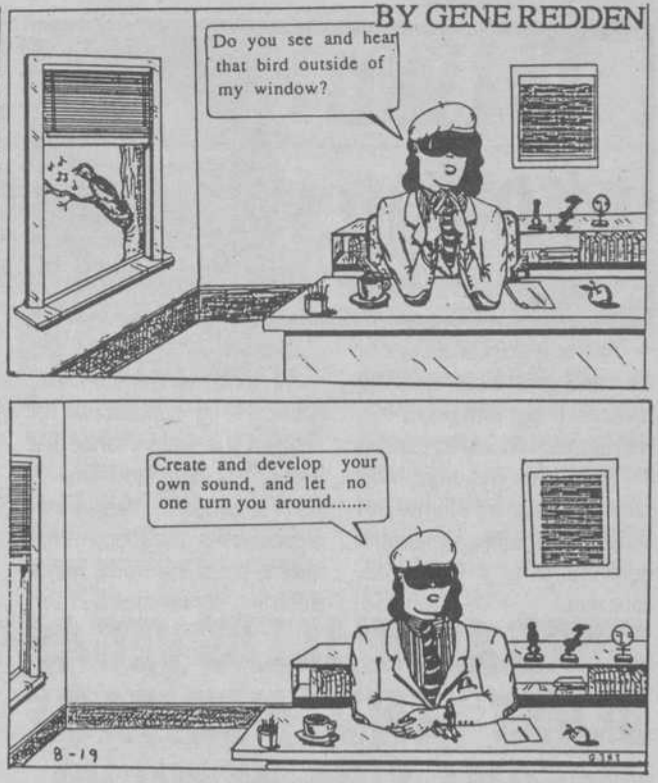

seventy (70) museums which offer different types of exhibits to their visitors featuring public transportation, brewery, and telecommunication museums, as well as a museum of interest to children, and too many others to list in full here.

Brussels is without a doubt one of the gastronomic capitals of the world; not only because of

the number of restaurants (more than 1800), but particularly because of the superb array of dishes. It offers fine examples of culinary styles from all over the world, but it's title as a gourmet center has above all been acquired because of the high quality of it's French Cuisine. Typical Belgian specialties are drawn from many local recipes using meat, fish or poultry. Pheasant served with braised Belgian chicory, casserole of rabbit in beer, and mussels served in many different ways. Fresh sea food, lobster, and veal are incredible choices of cuisine to enjoy when dining out. Those with a sweet tooth will enjoy Belgium waffles, spicy biscuits, and the famous praline chocolates which are the envy of the world.

It is no secret that Belgium is the land of good beer. There are many breweries and countless

different varieties of beer. There is one very special and easily distinguished type of spontaneously fermented beer which is locally brewed, and named Lambic, Gueuze or Kirer. These beers have a slightly bitter taste which is wonderfully refreshing.

At eight o'clock in the evening Brussels becomes alive again. A huge list of theaters, cinemas, concerts, jazz clubs and discotheques, all of very high quality are choices that may be considered for your entertainment. The opera house is of course an outstanding choice with internationally famous productions.

At present Brussels is experiencing a rapid development which gives rise to serious traffic problems, especially at peak periods. The number of offices has increased since 1967 when NATO

transferred it's headquarters from Paris to Brussels.

The Brussels region simultaneously benefits and suffers from linguistic friction. Because of it's bilingual status it attracts numerous national groups that settling there, opt for linguistic neutrality. Flemish and French are the native languages.

Public transportation is convenient and comfortable. All parts of the city are easily accessible by metro (underground train), train, bus or taxi.

The region offers a range of hotel accommodations worthy of it's importance and it's international tourist activity. It has hotels of all categories to cater for the different requirements and varying budgets of it's countless visitors.

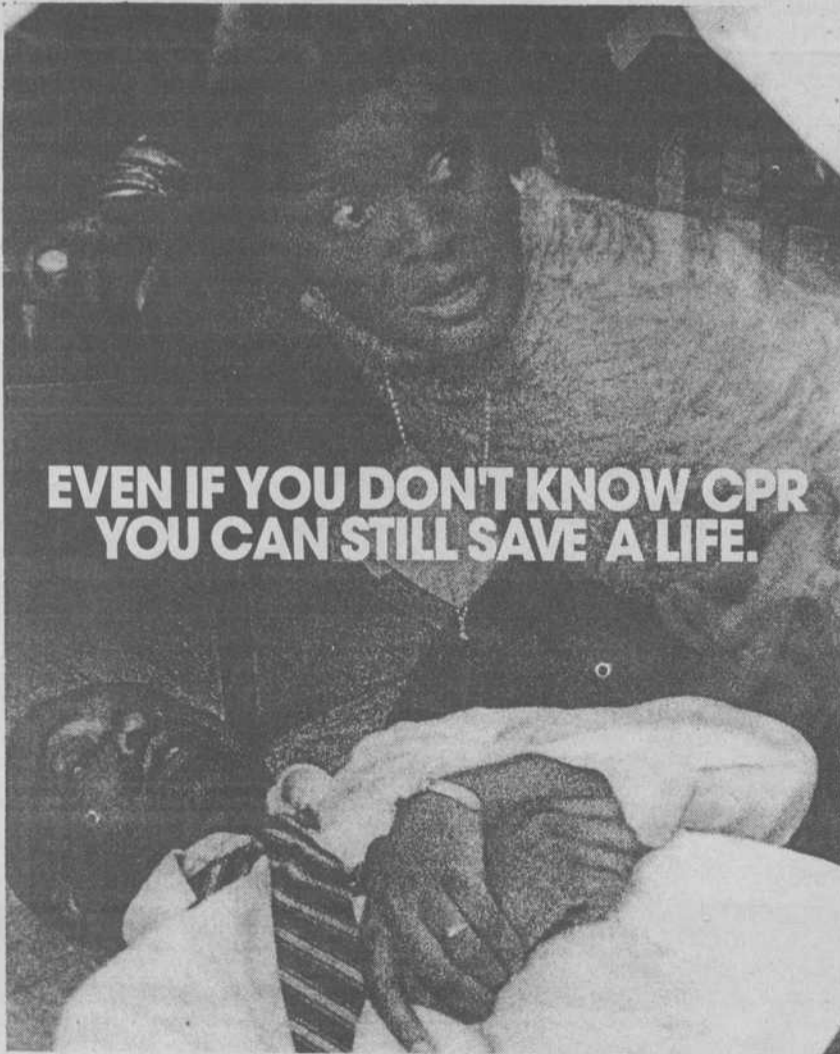
Virtually every weekend is marked by festivals in which carnivals, firework displays, military marches, historic festivals or simple popular fairs, an flee markets take place and are a testimony to the Belgium way of life.

**HELPFUL HINTS**

1. Weather - Rain common during summer, spring, and fall. Make sure to take a raincoat and umbrella.

3. Fresh Belgium Chocolate is better than Swiss Chocolate. Don't hurt yourself by eating too much.
4. You cannot order hot food in any restaurants between the hours of 3 p.m. and 6:30 p.m. Be sure to keep this in mind when planning lunch & dinner.
5. To save money, stay in a Belgium Hotel which is very clean, spacious, comfortable and offers Continental Breakfast included in the rate.
