### "AL STEWART, PROVEN FRIEND TO MANKIND..."

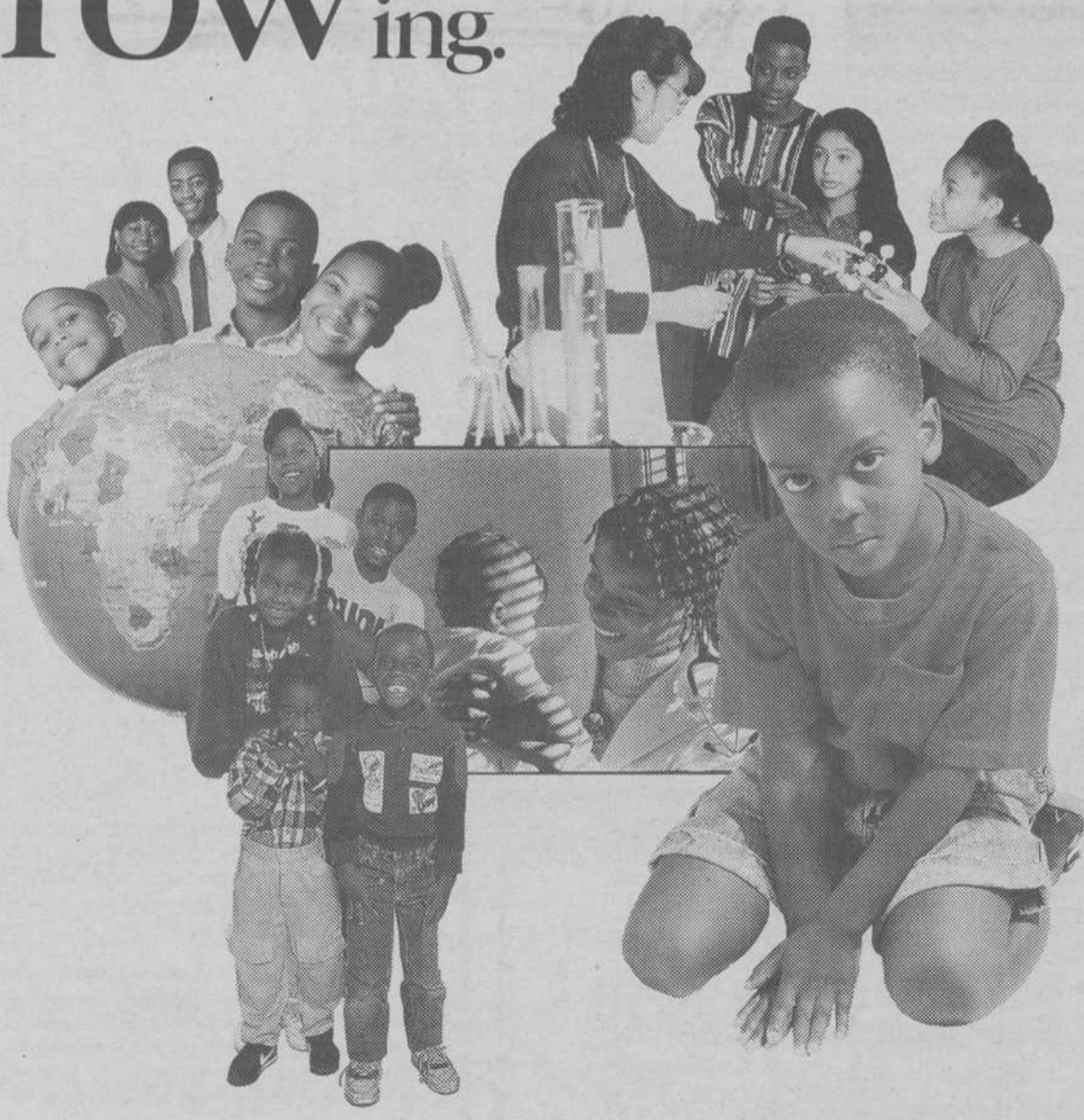
Our mailbag produced a letter from the friends of Al Stewart that reads as follows:
