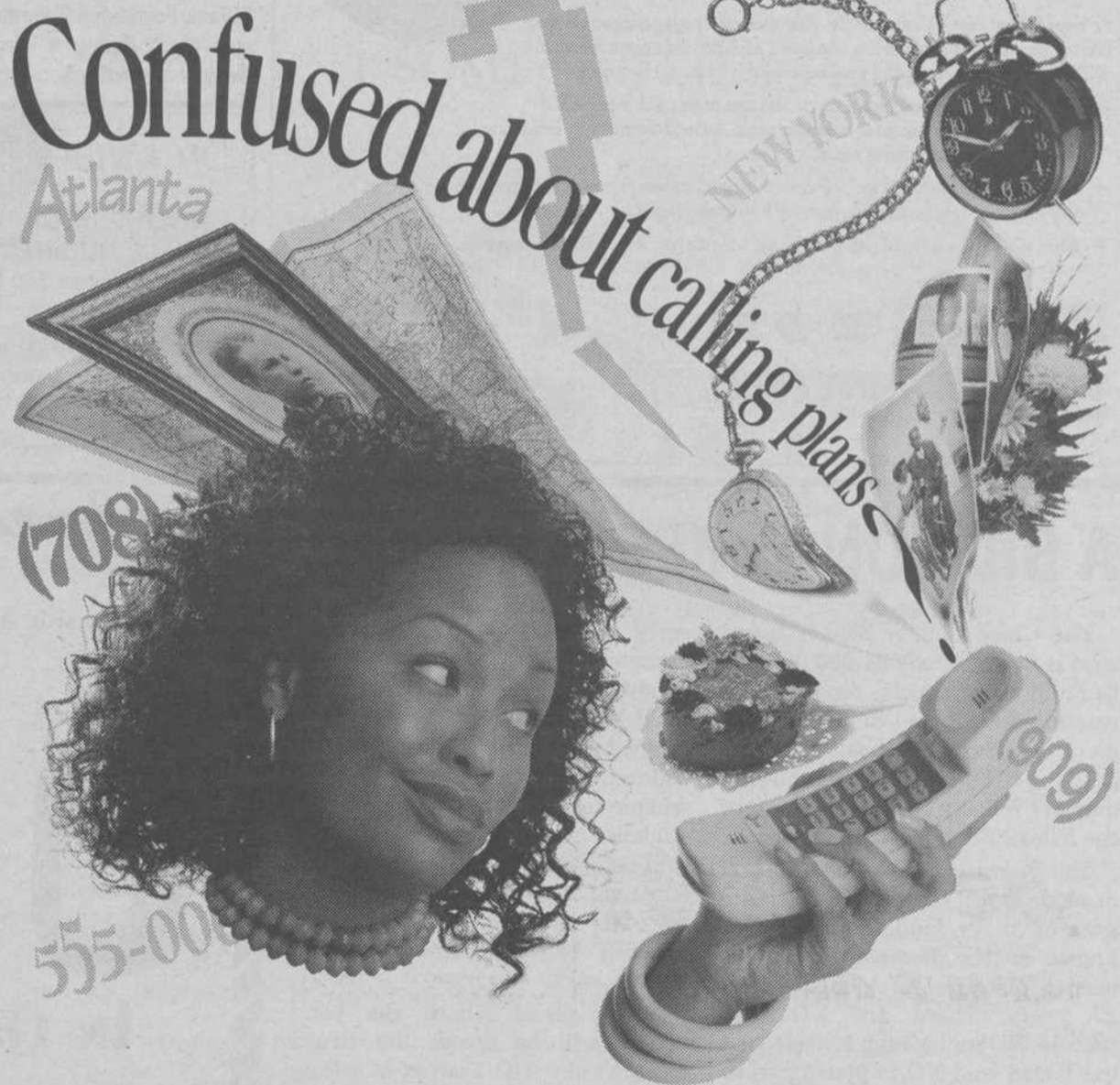
"SPOOKY HAPPENINGS AT THE LAS VEGAS NATURAL HISTORY MUSEUM"
