(Continued from Page 17) FREDERICK DOUGLASS, "Douglass seems to have believed that America was about possibility, and he was happy to use his own life as a model to try to exhibit that."

Douglass' life was not without controversy. His fierce attacks on Southern slaveholders, on the hypocrisy of American religion and the profiting of Northern businessmen brought him public scrutiny and violent physical attacks. When he left the pacifist Garrisonian abolitionist movement to be an independent voice, some whites took exception to the free-thinking attitude of this young black man. When Douglass publicly ridiculed some African-American leaders who advocated mass exodus from America in search of freedom, he
