SAN FRANCISCO (Reuter) - Almost two-thirds of young people believe that some influence children to be disrespectful toward their parents or to have sex when they are too young, a national poll of children says.

The poll said the vast majority of children - 82 percent believed television shows should help teach children right from

The poll is the first to focus television shows and movies exclusively on what young people think about values in the media, according to Children Now, a non-partisan advocacy organization for children that commissioned the survey.

Sixty-five percent said shows like "The Simpsons" and "Married ... With Children" encourage children to disrespect their parents, Children Now said Monday. Sixty-two percent said that sex on television shows and movies influences children to have sex when they are too

"Kids today spend more time watching TV and movies than they do in the classroom," James Steyer, president of Children Now, said in a statement. "Our poll shows that kids themselves believe that television and the movies are sending a variety of potentially negative signals to young people in the audience."

The telephone poll of 750 children, aged 10 to 16, was carried out January 16-19 by Fairbank, Maslin, Maullin & Associates and has a margin of error of three percentage points.

Children Now also released a second study by Katharine Heintz-Knowles, assistant professor of communications at the University of Washington, examining how children are portrayed in entertainment programs on broadcast and cable television.

The study found that a majority of child characters on commercial broadcast television engaged in "anti-social behaviors such as lying, neglecting their responsibilities, or being either physically or verbally aggressive," Children Now said.

Some of these behaviors, including physical aggression and deceitful behavior, are frequently shown to be effective in meeting the television character's goals, reinforcing a potentially negative message to children watching, it said.
