sought to live in the neighborhoods that we desired to live instead of being told to live in the slave quarters we were assigned to. We demanded, in essence, the same American dream that had been afforded to other Americans for hundreds of years. We came to understand that we were worthy of love and respect not only from others, but from ourselves as well. And, when we presented this idea of self love of the black people, we were met with resistance, brute force, and even death.

Those black warriors of the slavery era and of the sixties who stood up and cried that black was beautiful and freedom should be afforded to all were called "uppity niggers" who needed to be put in their place. A person who loves himself is apparently a threat to an oppressor, whether that oppressor be a slavemaster, lover or so-called friend. But, self love is a powerful machine fueled from God. God loves us and his purpose for us is to love Him and each other, but also ourselves. If God is in us, how can we not love our own selves, our own minds, our own bodies? He made us. He breathed life into us. He gave us life. That makes us all worthy to be loved.

biography, In the Spirit, told of how she saw possibilities. The faith exhibited by the Essence Magazine editor, said Mrs. Clinton will and has allowed all women to open themselves to possibilities.

Mrs. Clinton noted that the President has taken steps to help women and minorities succeed. She mentioned tax breaks that working mothers will receive to help their earnings go further and the role the Small Business Administration plays in giving small women business owners capital to start and expand their businesses.

She told the audience that black women who owned firms have grown from 158,000 in 1987 to 200,000 today.

Mrs. Clinton concluded by saying it takes personal and political courage to make a difference. She saluted the honorees as perfect examples of the courage America needs in the future.

Each year the NFBWBO hosts a luncheon in recognition of Black History Month honoring Black women of courage throughout the nation. This year's honorees included: Jeanette Brown, Deputy Director for the Office of Acquisition Management, Environmental Protection Agency; Cathy Hughes, CEO & Owner of Radio One, Inc.; Cassandra Pulley, Deputy Administrator of the U.S. Small Business Administration; Deborah Sawyer, President Environmental Design International, Inc.; Flóretta Dukes-McKenzie, President of the McKenzie Group; Victoria Buckley, Secretary of State, Colorado; and renowned gospel singer Shirley Caesar, President of Shirley Caesar Outreach Ministries.
