McNamara's book has opened old wounds-wounds which were never properly healed and suddenly feel raw again. He seems somewhat surprised by the controversy surrounding his book, by the negative newspaper editorials and the probing questions. When asked why didn't he say back then that the war was unwinable, when he might have been able to save thousands of lives, he tries to say that he did say it-to his colleagues.

I can't get past my cousin Charles, who went to Viet Nam in the infantry in 1967, at the height of the war. We he returned, he was never the same again.

For months afterward he slept sitting up and despite the injury sustained over there to his liver, he was constantly drinking. He wasn't able to keep a job and his marriage crumbled. Too soon we were sitting in that Baptist Church in Warrenton, Virginia listening to his eulogy.

If only Robert McNamara had the courage to say then what he saying now-strongly and publicly. Maybe my cousin Charles would have been celebrating his 50th birthday this year. Maybe that memorial wall in Washington would have been only a few hundred names.

Mandela could end up in jail. An illegal and unconstitutional investigation of me and my independent presidential campaign conducted by the FBI's counter terrorism division in 1988 and again in 1991 falsely branded me "armed and dangerous," a statement the FBI was later forced to retract. Presumably this bill could make terrorists out of the more than 100,000 Americans who have contributed to my political efforts.

The bill suspends posse comitatus - that time-honored democratic principle which forbids the military to get into the business of civilian law enforcement. It loosens the rules for the wiretaps, and reverses the presumption of innocence - accused persons are considered ineligible for bail.

The Oklahoma City bombing is being used in the crudest and most despicable kind of political gamesmanship by our President and other politicians of both parties. The men, women and children who died in the blast deserve more than cynical electioneering. Hopefully, their legacy will be a more fervent and independent coming together of all the American people to take our government and our country back.
