Over the last year there's been an intensification of a twodecade discussion and debate about the issue of independent politics: does an independent party represent a more intelligent and potentially powerful road for Black America than the Democratic Party? This debate was a centerpiece of the dialogue at the New York State Black Convention convened by the Reverend Al Sharpton, which I

co-led. The 300-plus delegates voted overwhelmingly to endorse moving in the direction of an independent party. They also voted to support term limits, thereby breaking with Democratic Party Black elected officialdom, which unanimously (and self-servingly) opposes limiting the terms of elected officials.

During the course of this debate, which I know will continue beyond the Black

line. But he also pointed an angry finger at the problem of the party line. People of color cannot trust the two major parties, he told us, and with good reason. We were in slavery when both the Republicans and the Democrats were founded. We did not build those parties. They are not ours. We may have visited them along the way, but they are not our true home.

Malcolm X affirmed our independent identity. He castigated the two major parties for their racism. And although he was assassinated before his movement could turn its attention to electoral politics, he believed deeply in our spiritual and political independence.

Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., together with masses of courageous Black people, placed the issue of democracy, fairness and voting rights on the national agenda. He inspired all America to care about the issues of political choice and the sacred right to exercise that choice. Dr. King took the issue of political choice very seriously. He was considering a run for the presidency as an independent in the year before his death.

Then came the 1972 National Black Political Convention in Gary, Indiana. The question of Democrat vs. independent was intensely discussed at that convention.

The Reverend Jesse Jackson was among those to support the idea of a Black-led, multi-racial third party. Although Rev. Jackson went on to run for the presidency twice in the Democratic primaries and made history in doing so, he continues to assert African American political independence and the prospect of a third party move.



For Rev. Jackson, this remains a live option 23 years after he first endorsed it.

Rev. Sharpton is likewise a political independent. He and I have worked, at times together and at times separately, sometimes in agreement and sometimes not. Many participants noted and applauded that the convention became the occasion for our return to a political partnership. I have been building a road

to Black participation and leadership in anew majority third party for 15 years. In the last several years we have seen that process move forward in ways which are complicated and dangerous, but also very exciting. The decision taken at the Gary convention 23 years ago to focus on increasing the number of Black elected officials through the Democratic Party was a tactic, not a strategy. Our politics and our sensibility have always been, and will always be, independent.

Today, much of America is in a rebellious and independent mood. African Americans, people are beginning to look at the opportunities for political repositioning.

Things are moving. Some of us are moving. I urge all Black America to move with us to what is ultimately our rightful and
