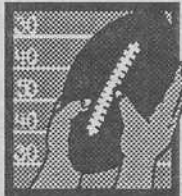

Florida State Remains Atop USA Today/CNN Poll

Florida State hung on to the number one ranking following a weekend of upsets in the latest U-S-A Today/C-N-N Coaches college football poll released this morning.

Florida State (5-0), which routed arch-rival Miami, 41-17, Saturday, remained on top with 1,513 points and 33 first-place votes.

Nebraska (5-0), which was idle, is second with 1,500 points

and 24 first place votes.

Florida (5-0) moved up one spot to third following a 28-10 win over number 21 Louisiana State.

Ohio State (5-0), which posted a come-from-behind, 28-25 road victory over Penn State, moves up to fourth and has the remaining three first place votes.

Southern California (5-0) dropped one spot to fifth, despite a 26-16 win over California

Saturday.

Auburn (5-1), Tennessee (5-1), Kansas State (5-0), Kansas (5-0) and Colorado (5-1) round out the top 10. Kansas made the biggest jump of the week, up from 19th, following a 40-24 win over Colorado, which had been ranked sixth.

Michigan (5-1), which was upset by Northwestern, is 11th, followed by Oklahoma (4-1), Texas (4-1), Alabama (4-1),

Oregon (4-1), Virginia (5-2) and Northwestern (4-1).

Texas A&M (2-2), which was upset by Texas Tech Saturday, slipped to 18th. Stanford (4-0-1), Penn State (3-2), Notre Dame (4-2), Iowa (4-0), Baylor (3-1), Syracuse (4-1) and Wisconsin (2-1-1) round out the top 25.

Washington, Arkansas, Louisiana State and U-C-L-A dropped out of the poll following weekend losses.

Chris Webber Signs With Resurgent Bullets

LANDOVER, Md. — Power forward Chris Webber officially signed a multi-year contract with the Washington Bullets on Monday.

The Bullets originally announced Sunday that they had

Washington, and Chris Webber is going to lead the way."

Webber will join the Bullets at the team's training camp at Shepherd College in Shepherdstown, West Virginia tonight.

The Bullets acquired Webber from the Golden State Warriors in exchange for forward Tom Gugliotta and three first round picks last November. Webber played 54 games for the Bullets last season and led the team in scoring (20.1 ppg), rebounding (9.6 rpg), steals (1.54 spg) and minutes (38.3).

The 22-year-old Webber was the top overall pick in the 1993 draft by the Orlando Magic following a short but brilliant collegiate career at Michigan where he and fellow Bullets forward Juwan Howard were part of the legendary "Fab Five"

freshman class.

Following the selection, Webber was part of a draft day deal that sent him to the Golden State Warriors.

Webber averaged 17.5 points and 9.1 rebounds in 1993-94 to capture NBA Rookie of the Year honors and led the Warriors to the playoffs.

But Webber was involved in a bitter contract dispute with then Warriors coach-general manager Don Nelson and exercised a one-year out clause in his contract. When the bitterness escalated between Webber and Nelson, Webber expressed a desire to be traded.

right uppercut and then a left-right-left combination.

In the sixth Lewis picked up where he left off, launching crunching shots that shivered through the fading Morrison.

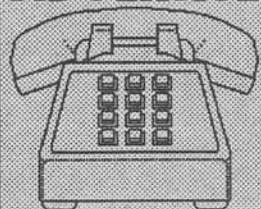
"I believe I have the superior jab in the division and during the first couple of rounds he handled it," said Lewis. "But then after the third round it began getting in. I just realized that if I was patient and used my jab and combinations it wouldn't last long."

Morrison, 26, who fell to 45-3-1, dismissed speculation of retirement. "A lot of people are very quick to count me out. I've only had two losses before tonight."

"Lennox Lewis showed tonight why he's a former world champion. He's young and powerful."

Lewis raised his record to 28-1, with 24 wins coming within the distance.
