NEW YORK - Former New York Mets star pitcher Dwight Gooden, who missed the entire 1995 season after being suspended for drug use, signed a one-year deal Monday with the New York Yankees.

Terms were not disclosed but the Yankees said they have options on the former National League Cy Young Award winner for the 1997 and 1998 seasons.

Gooden, 30, who initially underwent drug rehabilitation in 1987, was suspended in June 1994 for testing positive for cocaine. He was suspended again last September for the entire 1995 season for violating his aftercare program.

The deal reunites Gooden with former Mets teammates Darryl Strawberry, who joined the Yankees this summer after serving a suspension of his own, and David Cone, who was acquired from the Toronto Blue Jays late in the season.

Gooden was named National League Rookie of the Year in 1984 when he went 17-9 with a 2.60 ERA. Gooden, the Cy Young Award winner with a 24-4 record in 1985, was 3-4 with a 6.31 ERA in the strike-shortened 1994 season for the Mets. He was in the final year of a contract with the team.

Gooden admitted to a cocaine problemion April 1987, and underwent rehabilitation at the Smithers Clinic in New York. He returned to pitch on June 5,

He went 15-7 in 1987 and had 18 wins in 1988 and 19 in 1990. He has not posted more than 13 victories in any of the past three seasons, and has not had a winning season since going 13-7 in 1991.

"We're very happy to have Dwight as a member of the Yankees," said club owner George Steinbrenner. "Scouts from other organizations who have watched him pitch have
