We've seen this scenario in operation before. It is easier to discredit one group and make a misleading story believable when those you attempt to discredit "happen to be" black.

A perfect example is what's

happening with primarily Black Haitian and mostly-White Cuban refugees. The Haitians are being sent back to Haiti. But the Cuban refugees are being quietly admitted to the U.S.

No matter how you look at it, AIDS under any circumstances is a tragic disease. The challenge is ours to stop using AIDS as a charade for excluding certain groups from this country solely on the basis of skin color and race. To know is to grow. Until next week.


