Blues Singer Guy Davis Stars In One-Man Show

Meet Guy Davis as Fishy Waters, an archetypal southern blues musician, in his one-man

show "In Bed With the Blues: The Adventures of Fishy Waters," at the Reed Whipple Cultural Center, 821 Las Vegas Boulevard North, on Friday, November 3 at 8:00 p.m.

The show, set in 1959, is an engaging composite of blues concert, storytelling and fictional remembrance, laced with the Delta Blues songs of the 1920s and '30s. Davis, an accomplished blues singer, writer and actor, blends original material with works of legendary performers. He comes from a rich heritage of acting and singing

genes (his parents are Ossie Davis and Ruby Dee) and in 1991 made his Broadway debut in the Hurston/Hughes collaboration "Mulebone" which featured the music of Taj Mahal. This program is presented

by the Cultural and Community Affairs Division, City of Las Vegas Department of Parks and Leisure Activities.

Tickets are \$10 for adults and \$8 for students, seniors and persons with disabilities.
