(Continued from Page 5) nation is moving toward two societies, one black, one white, separate and unequal."

It added: "What White Americans have never understood - but what the Negro can never forget — is that white society is deeply implicated in the ghetto. White institutions created it, white institutions maintain it, white society condones it.'

The starting point for many racial discussions these days is the Simpson trial and Monday's rally by at least 400,000 black men seeking unity as the way to restore health to their communities ridden by crime and

Blacks cheered the verdict finding the athlete not guilty of murdering his ex-wife and her friend. Whites cried foul and blamed a mostly black jury for ignoring "the truth." According to many black commentators, whites reacted with a kind of "white riot" - gestures of hostility towards blacks.

A murder trial had become something akin to a football game with the cheers breaking down on racial lines.

Last Monday, when black men filled the National Mall in Washington to take part in the Million Man March, blacks saw one demonstration and whites another. On the Mall, shoulderto-shoulder for block upon block, were black men drawn to display their desire to take reponsibility for their communities. For blacks, it was a moment of hope.

But many whites, watching on television and unable to feel the crowd's mood, did not necessarily understand.

They saw television turn the demonstration into the Louis Farrakhan show and tried to puzzle out how much the black separatist firebrand, who organised the march, represented black America.

Farrakhan spoke for 2.5 hours, comparing himself to Moses and Jesus, telling whites "I don't need you to validate me," presenting soaring visions of blacks reclaiming their communities from drugs and crime and descending into arcane discussions of Freemasonry and numerology.

It was just another day when blacks and whites saw two different Americas.

South, don't think you are safe from the dangerous effects of cold

Hypothermia, a condition resulting from dangerously low body temperatures, can occur even when it is only 50 degrees outside. Hypothermia has been reported even in tropical climates, said Dr. Joseph Varon of Baylor College of Medicine in Houston.

Infants and the elderly are at highest risk. Babies' bodies lose heat faster because the surface area is larger in proportion to their weight than in adults.

In other people, the body gradually loses its cold sensitivity. Elderly people are less likely to detect temperature drops, and they recover more slowly from lowered body temperature. Tranquilizers and alcohol can complicate things.

Early warning signs of hypothermia include a pale, puffy face; drowsiness; drop in blood pressure; and forgetfulness.
