The "Bid Guarantee" shall consist of a firm commitment such as a Bid Bond, certified check, or other negotiable instrument accompanying a Bid as assurance that the Bidder will, upon acceptance of his Bid, execute such contractual documents as may be required within the time specified.

Sealed proposals for furnishing all labor, equipment, materials, and services required for the performance of the work specified by Las Vegas Valley Water District Contract No. 779 entitled "REHABILITATION OF WELL NOS. 1A AND 13" will be received at the office of the Director of General Services, Clark County Purchasing Division, 4th Floor, 500 South Grand Central Parkway, Las Vegas, Nevada 89155 up to and including 2:15 p.m. Wednesday, November 29, 1995, at which time they will be publicly opened and read aloud. Proposals transmitted by way of overnight mail must use 89101 as the zip code in place of 89155.

Contract Volumes consisting of documents, specifications and reduced drawings may be obtained at the Clark County Department of General Services, Purchasing Division for the nonrefundable cost of \$25.00. Checks must be received at the above office and be payable to "Clark County Treasurer". Proposals shall be submitted on the sheets bound in the Contract Volume, and the complete Contract Volume submitted to comprise a complete bid.

The site of the work is located at Well Nos. 1A and 13. Well No. 1A is located on the west side of Jones Boulevard north of Charleston Boulevard. Well No. 13 is within the District's North Well Field located at the northeast corner of the intersection of Alta Drive and Valley View Boulevard. The work consists of removing and replacing the existing pumping units with new pumping units and rehabilitating the wells utilizing chemical treatments and wire brushing. The existing motors shall be utilized at each well.

The work shall commence within thirty (30) consecutive calendar days after the effective date of the Notice to Proceed. All work shall be completed by May 11, 1996.

Pursuant to Nevada Revised Stat-

utes, Chapter 338, bidders are hereby notified that the prevailing wage rates established by the Nevada State Labor Commissioner must be paid to all workmen engaged in the performance of any public work construction contracts awarded for the amount of \$100,000.00 or more. Said prevailing wage rates effective October 1, 1994, through September 30, 1995, as issued by the State of Nevada, Office of Labor Commissioner, are included in the Contract Volume.

It shall be the responsibility of the bidder submitting a proposal to a public body for a public work to ascertain the relevancy Nevada Revised Statute 338.147, as amended by the 1991 Nevada Legislature Session, as it relates to preference for local contractors when a Nevada public body awards a contract for a public work. The bidder is also responsible for completion of the bidder's certification and for providing proof that the payment of Nevada sales, use and motor vehicle taxes has been made for five successive years prior to submitting the proposal.

Bidders must hold a valid license of a "Class" and a "Monetary Limit" corresponding to the work to be performed, in accordance with the provisions of the State of Nevada Contractor's License Law and NRS 338.145. Each proposal must be accompanied by a certified or cashier's check or bid bond in the form shown in the Contract Volume or other acceptable form, in the amount of ten (10) percent of the total bid price as a guarantee that the bidder, if an award is made to him in accordance with the provisions of the proposal, will execute an agreement in the required form, secure the required insurance and furnish the required bonds.

The Las Vegas District is requesting Statement of Qualifications from professional engineering firms for providing design, construction and special engineering services. The services primarily include the preparation of construction contract documents consisting of plans, specifications, and cost estimates. If interested and qualified, a separate proposal should be submitted for each of the following two water facility projects:

PROJECT 1): MCP 95-22, SPRING MOUNTAIN-DURANGO 2975 ZONE PUMPING STATION DISCHARGE PIPELINE

Design of 8,300 linear feet of 66-inch diameter pipeline in Spring Mountain Road from Riley Street, westerly to Hualapai Way. Also 1,350 linear feet of 30-inch diameter pipeline in Grand Canyon Drive from Spring Mountain Road, northerly to Desert Inn Road.

PROJECT 2): MCP 95-19, SPRING MOUNTAIN RESERVOIR EXPANSION; MCP 95-20, SPRING MOUNTAIN-DURANGO 2860 ZONE PUMPING STATION ADDITION; AND MCP 95-21, SPRING MOUNTAIN-DURANGO 2975 ZONE PUMPING STATION PHASE I

MCP 95-19: Design of a 20 million gallon reinforced concrete, underground potable water reservoir. MCP 95-20 and 95-21: Design of two large multiple pump (500 hp to 1300 hp), pumping stations enclosed in one large building complex. Building interior, exterior, and existing site facilities to include architectural design treatment features and respective improvements. These facilities are to be located on the southwest corner of the Riley Street/Spring Mountain Road intersection.

After the proposals are evaluated, oral interviews may then be conducted with firms that are short listed for each specific project. Compensation will not be a consideration in the selection process, but will be considered within the negotiation process.

Each proposals shall consist of a

completed U.S. Government Standard Form 255 (most recent revision) and no more than six additional pages. Pages and/or submittals beyond these will not be reviewed. The submittals must clearly indicate the proposed team members likely to be assigned to the projects, which staff members are locally based, and which are located at other offices, if applicable. Projects that were completed by employees while working for other firms must also be indicated.

Proposal evaluations will consider the following factors, among others:

- 1) Recent experience (within the last five years) pertaining to the design and construction of the appropriate project type listed above. Must show experience designing large (10 MG) concrete reservoirs, 1000 hp multiple pump pumping stations, and 30-inch to 66-inch diameter pipeline.
- 2) Telemetry, instrumentation, and process control experience.
- 3) Successfully having provided similar services to a water utility organization.
- 4) Local Las Vegas office and technically experienced, professional staff.
- 5) Computer capabilities, including AutoCAD software.
- 6) Subconsultants (geotechnical, surveying, architectural, electrical, mechanical).
- 7) Office workload and staff availability.
- 8) Proposed Project Manager and Project Engineer assignments.
- 9) General Liability and Errors and Omissions insurance.

Individual proposals for each of the two projects must be submitted, in triplicate, in a single sealed envelope, labeled on the outside with the project title. 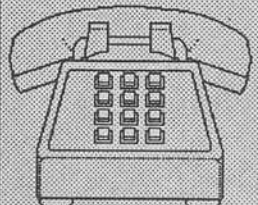
